Advent at Home



"I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I."

- Matthew 3:11

Almost nine hundred years ago, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux suggested in one of his Advent homilies that we should think of three Advents of Christ: the First, when Christ came in humility as Mary's Child, clothed in our human nature; the Second, when Christ will come in glory as Judge and Redeemer of the world. Then Saint Bernard speaks of a Middle Coming, an "in the meantime" Advent, when Christ comes to us in his Word, in the Eucharist, and in those who need our love and care, family and friends, neighbors and strangers. That's this year's Advent, the one we're celebrating now; and this Advent's question is: how attentive am I to Christ's coming into my life-story, right here, right now?

What earthly underlakings do I need to set aside so that I can set out to meet God's Son?

Gospel Summary

In Matthew's Gospel, we learn of John's continued warning for us to be ready for Jesus when he comes again. It is not enough that we are sons and daughters of Abraham, but by our own desire, we want to live a life pleasing to God. The Gospel challenges us to bear fruit. It was not enough for the Sadducees nor is it enough for us to simply follow the rules and rituals of our faith. The very actions of lives must show what we believe about our faith.

Reflection for Families

We Christians come in daily contact with other people whether at work, in our neighborhoods, or school. We have opportunities throughout the day to witness to our faith by our actions and words, but what greater audience do we have than our own children? They watch us and listen to us. They imitate our every action and mimic our expressions. It is important that we witness our faith to all we meet, but no audience is more important than our families. Sometimes we need to take some quiet "desert time" like we find in today's Gospel in order to focus our lives more intentionally on what is truly important.

Bringing the Gospel Into Your Family

Continue using the Advent wreath as a tool for prayer. Light the second candle today and offer one suggestion of something you will do this week to take some quiet, reflective time. Think of at least one way you (individually or as a family) will create peace for yourself or someone near you.

Discussion Questions

- It's hard for me to slow down, but I know I need to when . . .
- One way others (especially my family members) see the Kingdom of God in my actions is when...
- In order to prepare the heart of our family for Christmas we need to . . .

Prayer

Sit for a moment in silence.

God of Heaven, thank You for the *peace* Your Son Jesus promised, not as the world gives, but willing, deep, lasting, and abiding peace. Thank You that, since we have been justified through faith, we have *peace* with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace. May the Lord of peace Himself give us *peace* at all times and in every way. Grant that, as far as it depends on us, we may live at *peace* with everyone, making every effort to do what leads to *peace*. So, let the *peace* of God, which transcends all understanding, guard our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus and the *peace* of Christ rule in our hearts, now and forever more. Amen.






