#### **MINISTRY OF HOPE**

The members of the Ministry of Hope recognize that the families with whom they work are experiencing a loss and that the family members need guidance to navigate the planning of the funeral liturgy. Perhaps the most important aspect of their service is to be able to listen to these grieving families, to let them express their feelings of loss, and to let these families know that we are there to help them through a difficult process. Members of this ministry meet with the families of the deceased and answer questions which arise regarding the wake, funeral, and burial. They review the funeral liturgy, readings, and music with the families and assist them in making appropriate choices for the funeral Mass. Members of the Ministry of Hope attend the wake and participate in the wake service; they also assist at the funeral Mass and in the burial service. In the event that the priest is not able to attend the wake or to conduct the graveside service, the Ministers of Hope will lead the wake and graveside services as lay presiders. In short, the Ministry of Hope follows the family throughout the entire process, from the planning meeting to the wake service to the funeral Mass and, finally, to the graveside service. Prospective Ministry of Hope members must undergo a training process to ensure they are very capable and comfortable in assisting members of our parish who are grieving the loss of a loved one.

#### **ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (OCIA) - BECOMING CATHOLIC**

An ongoing process of faith formation is offered for adults and older children who would like to join the Catholic Church, and also for baptized Catholics who have yet to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and 1<sup>st</sup> Eucharist. Catechists and sponsors accompany candidates on their faith journeys, offering support and encouragement as they learn what it means to become a Catholic Christian. ## **Volunteer Requirements**

At Blessed Trinity Parish we strive to ensure the safety of our children, youth, elderly and disabled brothers and sisters. All volunteers must adhere to the guidelines set forth by the Archdiocese of Boston as outlined below.

Protecting God's Children Workshops (PGC) - All volunteers, age 18 and above, are required to participate in a one-time Protecting God's Children (PGC) awareness training - regardless of whether or not you work directly with children. Currently, this workshop is being offered via Zoom on almost weekly basis by the Archdiocese of Boston. To register, go to our website at <a href="https://www.BlessedTrinityCatholic.org">www.BlessedTrinityCatholic.org</a>, go to the Stewardship tab and select "Volunteer Requirements." On that page there is a link to locate PGC workshops. (After clicking the link, select "Boston, MA Archdiocese" from the drop-down menu. If you attend one of these Zoom sessions, or have attended a workshop elsewhere, please furnish the parish office with a copy of your certificate of attendance.

<u>Diocesan Volunteer Application:</u> This form is now required for all volunteers, feel free to download it and fill it out if you haven't already (only needs to be done once) it available on our website at the Volunteer Requirements page. It is also available at both churches.

Annual Background Checks (CORI) - It is the policy of the Archdiocese of Boston that all staff and volunteers (age 18 and above) have an annual background check (CORI). All CORI forms must be verified, in person, using a government issued photo ID. You can do this at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Forms are also available on our website at the Volunteer Requirements page (see above).

<u>Code of Ministerial Behavior</u> - It is the policy of the Archdiocese of Boston that all staff and volunteers (age 18 and above) read the Code. Again, this can be found on the Volunteer Requirements page of the website.

<u>Sexual Harassment Policy</u> - All volunteers are asked to review this policy. This is updated on an annual basis. This can also be found on the Volunteer Requirements page of the website.
