Volunteer Requirements

At Blessed Trinity Parish we strive to ensure the safety of our children, youth, elderly and disabled brothers and sisters. All volunteers must adhere to the guidelines set forth by the Archdiocese of Boston as outlined below.

Protecting God's Children Workshops (PGC) - All volunteers, age 18 and above, are required to participate in a one-time Protecting God's Children (PGC) awareness training – regardless of whether or not you work directly with children. If you have attended a workshop elsewhere, please furnish the parish office with a copy of your certificate of attendance. Currently, this workshop is being offered via Zoom on a weekly basis by the Archdiocese of Boston. To register, volunteers can go to our website at www.BlessedTrinityCatholic.org, go to the Stewardship tab and select "Volunteer Requirements". On that page there is a link to locate PGC workshops. (After clicking the link, select "Boston, MA Archdiocese" from the drop-down menu). Volunteers are asked to provide a copy of their certificate of attendance to the parish office.

Annual Background Checks (CORI) - It is the policy of the Archdiocese of Boston that all staff and volunteers (age 18 and above) have an annual background check (CORI). All CORI forms must be verified, in person, using a government issued photo ID. You can do this at the Parish Office during regular office hours. Forms are also available on our website at the Volunteer Requirements page (see above).

<u>Code of Ministerial Behavior</u> - It is the policy of the Archdiocese of Boston that all staff and volunteers (age 18 and above) read the Code. Again, this can be found on the Volunteer Requirements page of the website.

<u>Sexual Harassment Policy</u> - All volunteers are asked to review this policy. This is updated on an annual basis. This can also be found on the Volunteer Requirements page of the website.
