Dear Friends of SKDS:

You've heard the saying, "In this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes." and another, "variety is the spice of life."



Still— change and too many choices can be overwhelming, especially when they seem to come at you fast and furious. But constant they are. Let's look for a moment at our very own SKDS. Just a few short years ago we celebrated 150 years of Catholic education in Beaver Dam. That's quite a milestone. For many of those years, things moved along, at what we now consider to be, an amiable speed. The pace has picked up considerably in a relatively short time given the use of social media, cell phones, the internet, world wide travel, etc. We are always on; there is no down time. Someone always expects an answer now or sooner. There seems to be little time to really think.

Our challenge as educators is to help students learn how to sift through the cacophony of the background interference in order to make sound decisions. Critical decision making is still an essential skill; it's just more difficult but more vital than ever.

In those 150 plus years of sustained Catholic education, many changes have taken place right here in Beaver Dam as well. We started out as St. Mary School, a single parish school in 1862; gradually grew into three individual parish schools St. Peter (1855), St. Michael (1885) and St. Patrick (1949); consolidated as Unified Catholic Parish Schools (1981) and became a parish school again in 2003 as St. Katharine Drexel. More change followed, however this very last year

when we applied for and became accepted as a Choice School in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP). This is another new avenue for us. The WPCP gives families an opportunity to choose a school in which they want their children to be educated. For us, it means, they want their children to have a Catholic school education. The Catholic Church states that families are the first teachers of their children and we as educators are called to teach as Jesus did. Several families have applied to and have been accepted into the Choice program. We understand this is not the perfect plan and it is not a program for every family. But, it does provide help for some families; and we are happy to work with those for whom it offers an option for Catholic education just as we are pleased to work with all other families choosing SKDS for their children.

Now let's hear from one of our SKDS alums. John Pryme, a graduate of our wonderful school, has returned to us as our Youth Minister. What a delight to be able to work with him as he fulfills a vital role in our parish. When we first meet students, we plant seeds. Sometimes we are lucky enough to see how those seeds take root and flourish. We welcome John, now Mr. Pryme, with open arms and warm hearts. We also hear from two of our inimitable retired teachers, Kathy Armstrong and Barb Kalscheur, who share "SWEET MEMORIES" and toss out a challenge.

With each activity there was always a unique sense of comradery. I think this added so much to becoming such great friends with those around you. Of course, there was always the dichotomy of boys and girls; but everyone was always your friend and with these friends you went to class, you went to lunch, you went to

recess, you went to church, and you went to sports together. As with most things, you don't realize the significance until after the fact. One of the things I reflect on now is how much attending St. Katharine's mirrored being a part of the church community. Even being in church every Thursday morning for school Mass, having it look you in the face, sometimes you don't always see the obvious.

During 6th-8th grade, I grew tremendously, not physically, (that growth came much later (ii), but mentally and spiritually. For my mental growth I obviously commend St. Katharine's. Mrs. Thompson always had something new and interesting in science. Mrs. Scott tried to teach me Algebra but I must say that not everyone has a mathematical gift like our friend Brandon Minnig @! I say our because that is truly how I felt about the class who took me in. Everyone was a part of one body. Even if we didn't always do everything together, there was never a rift between us. He knew her; she knew him; the class was one. It helped in building a strong foundation that I continued to build on going into my older years. Spiritually, we attended Mass as a school every Thursday. The thing I remember most is the music. It wasn't music we always sang on Sunday but it was always fun. Going every week certainly helped build my base that brought me to where I am today.

Currently, I am the Youth and Young Adult Minister at St. Katharine Drexel Parish. If you had told me this was where I'd be during my school years, I would have said you were crazy. I would have said the same thing while in college! (I mean, this is the kid who lost his

retainer in the lunch garbage!) It goes to show that sometimes there is a bigger plan at work than meets the eye. I graduated from



St. Norbert College in 2015 with a degree in Marketing and I was happy but incomplete. I felt there was something more I wanted to do but just couldn't put my finger on it. I moved back to Beaver Dam after living in Madison, and shortly after, found myself being called to the Church. I hope to give the youth and young adults an opportunity to have the experience that I was blessed to have and to listen to what God is calling them to do and be. And~~ to have the courage to follow His voice.

Being able to work alongside the people who helped you grow as an individual is truly a surreal experience and I am blessed to be where I am today. More surreal still is coming home and being able to help shape the future of others and for that I thank St. Katharine Drexel.

Over 150 years ago, Catholic education began in Beaver Dam. Accreditation

After completing an intense year of self study, we were visited by a Team in November 2016 who reviewed all the documentation we had gathered in support of THE WISCONSIN CATHOLIC SCHOOLS ACCREDITATION DOMAINS (4), STANDARDS (13) AND BENCHMARKS (70).

Accreditation Continued

The 4 <u>Domains</u> are: Mission and Catholic Identity, Governance and Leadership, Academic Excellence and Operational Vitality.

"Catholic Schools in collaboration with parents and guardians as the primary educators, seek to educate the whole child by providing an excellent education rooted in Gospel values. Since the founding of the first Catholic school, the United States Catholic Bishops speaking in conference have supported Catholic schools as foundational to the mission of the Church..."

The <u>Standards</u> describe policies, programs, structures, and processes that should be present in mission-driven, program effective, well-managed, and responsibly governed Catholic schools that operate in concert with the defining characteristics.

The <u>Benchmarks</u> provide observable, measurable descriptors for each standard. Benchmarks provide a solid basis for future development of more detailed self-assessment and diagnostic instruments, data collection and reporting structures. These same documents, along with all the other materials gathered, were reviewed by the visiting team. The Visiting Team interviewed faculty, support staff, students, various committee members (School Board, Home and School, Athletics, PR/Marketing), Father Mike, Pastoral Council, Finance Council, etc. Families were selected randomly for phone interviews regarding our school.

SEVERAL RECOMMENDATIONS WERE MADE:

- That we provide a way to make intentional connections to the Gospel and Catholic faith teachings (in our service projects).
- That the head of maintenance be trained as a Designated Person for Asbestos (finished July 2017).
- That faculty routinely adjust instructional practices based on data and assessments.
- That we analyze our salary scale in comparison to local and regional schools.
- That we revisit our marketing plan and develop criteria for measurement, analysis or planning for enrollment.

COMMENDATIONS INCLUDED:

- The Catholic culture and faith are noted in a significant way by parents and those outside the immediate school community.
- SKDS integrates practice of the Church's social teachings.
- There is frequent celebration of liturgy as school and students play a variety of roles in it.
- LLFF is a great support for families.
- · There are efforts to invite the Bishop to

- celebrate Mass and attend significant school events and leadership encourages stakeholders to attend events sponsored by the Bishop.
- Board and leadership have policies in place that fully align with Archdiocesan policies, implemented and regularly monitored.
- Pastoral authority takes responsibility for development and oversight of the leadership team.
- There are a variety of services and programs offered and tied to student success.
- New members are included in finance council and school committee to provide a fresh perspective to the decisions made and for having local expertise in the community on their councils.

GOALS:

From the recommendations, we developed a series of goals that will guide us over the next several years.

Domain A:

- We will complete grade level maps to identify the incorporation of Catholic identity themes into all curricular areas to help students relate Church teachings to the world around them.
- We will incorporate a reflective component into 90% of our service projects to intentionally connect service with the Gospel and our Catholic Faith.

DOMAIN B:


 Develop a process and timeline for effectively communicating new initiatives/ program changes to various constituents.

DOMAIN C:

- Implement revised curriculum alignment documents as they are developed by the Archdiocese to sequentially document and review gaps and instructional effectiveness in all content areas.
- Create a process for review and analysis of formative, summative, authentic performance, and self-reflection assessment methods to assure alignment to learning outcomes and effectiveness in allowing students to demonstrate proficiency.

DOMAIN D:

- Strengthen our marketing plan in an effort to increase enrollment and to increase visibility in the community and surrounding areas through a variety of strategies.
- Use criteria for gathering, measuring, and analyzing enrollment data from new Archdiocesan program (MissionInsite).

Annually, the most prestigious award presented is the JERRY DORN/RANDY ARNDORFER CHRISTIAN SPIRIT AWARD. This Award honors those students who exemplify respect, courtesy, and concern for others. These students also demonstrate a willingness to share personal time and talent for the welfare of others. This award is named to honor both Jerry Dorn, son of Iva Dorn and the late Dudley Dorn, and Randy Arndorfer, son of the late Paul Arndorfer and the late Delores Arndorfer Jaehnke. During the 1977-1978 school year at St. Peter's School, Jerry Dorn, who was dying from a brain tumor, did his level best to meet the challenges life sent him. Randy Amdorfer tirelessly, unselfishly, and respectfully assisted his classmate, thus truly living the words of Christ, "Ask and you shall receive. Seek and you shall find. Knock and it shall be opened. When we present this award, we honor both of those individuals as part of the long, ongoing
