- 3. I attended the Principals' Opening Day in Milwaukee on August 6, which is put on by the AOM Schools Office. There were 115 school principals from the Arch in attendance. I attached the slide presentation for the day to the email. Feel free to review the information we covered, especially the marketing information on slides 48-56. I will share some additional information regarding this at our meeting.
- 4. Maintenance is almost done, and the building is almost ready for the start of school. Heide Antoni, who joined our maintenance team this summer, has painted the new classroom doors and the lockers on the first floor. Things look great!
- 5. Our Forward Exam data review session will be on Friday, August 15. SKDS Teachers of grades 3K-8 and Learning Resource teachers will meet at 9:30 a.m. in the Catacombs to review the Forward Exam results, set up our testing windows for Math and ELA for the year, and schedule the students working with our Learning Support teachers. Teachers in 3K-2 will be using new screening assessments this year and will prepare for their

- implementation at the August 15 meeting as well. Here is the <u>2025</u> Forward Exam Data for Grades 3-8 again for your review.
- 6. On Monday, August 18, we will start our in-service week by attending Mass at 8:20 a.m. and having breakfast with the school and parish staff in the Narthex. Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday will be filled with scheduled meetings.
- 7. This year's open house will begin with a parent meeting. We will all gather in the Church before having families visit the classrooms. This meeting is expected to last approximately 30 minutes. Families will then visit the classrooms, drop off school supplies, meet the teachers, and stop by Cougar's Closet, which will be set up in the gym, along with Home & School, and SCRIP. The open house runs from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM on Thursday, August 21.
- 8. We will have updated signs at all three school entrances (inside the building) displaying a welcome message, our theme, and our mission statement.
- 9. This summer, Home & School has purchased new tables for the 5K classroom and new desks and chairs for grade 2. They have purchased new playground equipment: basketballs, kickballs, soccer balls, jump ropes, and sidewalk chalk. The current members are seeking additional parents to become involved. Home & School will have a table set up in the gym at our Open House on August 21, providing treats and sharing more information about how to get involved and about upcoming events planned for this year. Home & School is also offering additional options to teachers to use the \$100 gift for classroom items this year. Teachers can be reimbursed for \$100 worth of purchases or receive a \$100 Walmart or Amazon gift card. (Subject to tax.)
- 10. Jennelle Buford, our IT Coordinator, started on June 23, and has done an excellent job at both the school and parish in preparation for the new school year. With having an on-site IT person, SKD is ending its services with InterQuest, and will be using Wire Technologies beginning September 2.

11. The move from PowerSchool to FACTS has been an arduous task for the office staff this summer. A huge debt of gratitude is owed to Patty Schmitt and Judy Wilson for getting us ready for the school year to begin. I am sure there are additional challenges ahead, which come with any change of this magnitude, but I am confident that all stakeholders will benefit from this change.

We have our audit by Vesta for school choice on August 11 & 12. 3K-8th Grade Student count to date: 179 students
The class schedules are completed, and everything looks good. However, the schedule is not finalized until we have completed a full week of school.
