

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul

Dear Brothers and sisters, today the church celebrates the two great apostles, Peter and Paul. The lives of these apostles were not primarily marked by their qualities, but by the personal encounter they had with Jesus. It was He who healed them and who turned them into apostles for others.

Peter was freed from his fear and insecurity. Despite being strong and impetuous, he experienced the bitter taste of defeat when after a whole night of work, he caught nothing. Faced with the empty nets, he could have been tempted to despair, to abandon everything. But by trusting in Jesus' words 'Put out into the deep water, and let down your nets' (Luke 5:4) he realized he should embrace everything instead. He was certain that being in the same boat with Jesus, there was nothing to fear.

Paul, on the other hand, was liberated "from the religious zeal that had made him a fierce defender of the traditions he had received" and in that he had not recognized Jesus as the expected Messiah. His strict observance of the law without that openness to Jesus had shut him off from divine love. But after his fall on the road to Damascus, he launched into a preaching typical of someone who "has intensely tasted the joy of being of God." His life, which perhaps only revolved around a set of precepts to fulfill, is later founded on that personal encounter with Christ.

Remember that the Church is not a community of perfect people but of sinners who must recognize their need for God's love and the need of being purified through the cross of Jesus Christ. Peter did not change overnight. In his life, he would continue to experience God's gifts and his own weaknesses. Everything that kept Saint Paul away from other men disappeared when he encountered the Lord. 'That event widened his heart, opened it to everyone.'

So, as we reflect on and celebrate the outcome of the lives of these two pillars of our faith and church, let us imitate their good examples. Through their exemplary lives, they teach us that conversion through repentance is a very important Christian step.

Remember: "God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"
