

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Seventeenth Sunday in the Ordinary Time (C)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday's readings teach us how to talk to God in prayer. We see that in the Old Testament, the essence of prayer is that man stands between good and evil, sin and guilt, justice and mercy from God, and moves the Lord to forgive or to bestow His gifts. In this sense we can see that: on the one hand, it is true that our supplications cannot change God, who is infinitely perfect. On the other hand, however, by having established a covenant with humans, the Lord has chosen in some way to make Himself vulnerable.

He is not alien or indifferent to our pleas, but rather, out of love for us, He gives us the power to move His heart, in order that He grant to us what we ask or to lessen the punishment we deserve. This is often seen when the patriarchs intercede for the chosen people; like Abraham for Sodom.

In the Gospel, Jesus adopts this confident way of praying, but perfects it with a decisive novelty. When the apostles ask him to teach them to pray, the Lord makes them see that the first condition for praying is to call God "Father," to feel like His children. It was a deeply rooted conviction among the early Christians to know that they could address God as beloved children. "The new life brought by Christ was presented to the eyes of those first believers as a life of beloved children of God." This was not a theoretical or abstract truth, but something real that filled them with overflowing joy.

The Lord's Prayer is the Christian's main prayer. In teaching it to the apostles, "Jesus does not leave us a formula to repeat it mechanically. As in all vocal prayer, the Holy Spirit, through the Word of God, teaches God's children to speak to their Father. Jesus not only teaches us the words of filial prayer, but also gives us the Spirit by which they become in us 'spirit and life'" (Jn 6:63). Moreover, the proof and possibility of our filial prayer is that the Father "has sent into our hearts the Spirit of the Son, who cries: 'Abba, Father'" (Gal 4:6).

On Friday July 18, I had a fun time with the men of the parish. There were twenty-five men who came. We got to know each other better and grow in friendship. Thanks for your time and presence. *Remember:*

"God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"


