FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The liturgy of the Word for this Sunday contains an incomparable richness that is worth savoring and contemplating with utmost attention, from the spirit of Faith and the conversion that characterizes us as Christians. Since conversion is one of the key words throughout the discipleship of Christ, as it is at the beginning of the journey and a constant call from the Lord given our fragile human condition. It is a process that involves a metanoia (conversion in Greek), a change of mentality that involves a constant renewal of our existence in light of the Gospel, which is not exclusive to priests or religious but to all those who wish to live authentically the call that God makes to them every day and from any vocation in the Church.

In today's gospel, Jesus speaks about a rich man, who has a bountiful harvest. Faced with such abundance, he thinks that from now on his existence will consist of relaxing, eating, drinking, and enjoying himself. 'But God said to him: "Fool, this night your life will be required of you. The things you have accumulated, whose will they be?". So it is with the one who stores up treasures for himself and is not rich toward God.' Therefore, Christ warns: 'Beware of all kinds of greed. For one's life does not consist in the abundance of their possessions' (Luke 12:13-21). Indeed, the vice of greed leads one to think that happiness is a matter of accumulating experiences or possessions; in contrast, anything that involves a renunciation is perceived as a drama, as it is not understood that one can be happy without a certain good or by depriving oneself of certain realities.

Jesus warns us about the danger that comes with greed and the accumulation of wealth because deep down He knows perfectly that all of this is "vanity of vanities" as the author of the first reading states (Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23). This does not mean that Jesus is entirely against wealth (which, in the Bible, is a sign of God's blessing), for although He was born into a humble family, He knows that one of the fruits of dignified work is the acquisition of certain material goods; what He opposes is the greedy and selfish attitude of many people who make money and wealth their only purpose in this life.

Carrying out the invitation of today's gospel is not an easy task, but it is possible. It requires a continuous process of conversion, a change of mindset, a search for what is fundamental and eternal, because "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:19-23).


