

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time

August 24 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Among the followers of Christ, questions arose. It was logical, as those who listened to him knew that he could provide answers to their deepest concerns. Some of these questions were about the identity of the Master, such as the occasion when the disciples of the Baptist asked him: 'Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?' (Luke 7:20). Other guestions revolved around how to properly interpret the law, what to do to inherit eternal life, with what power he performed miracles, and so forth. Today's Gospel recounts one of these inquiries: 'Lord, will there be few who are saved?' (Luke 13:23). Indeed, it was a highly debated issue, and it seemed that the Scriptures offered various interpretations: some argued that salvation was limited to a few chosen ones; others that it was practically impossible... Perhaps there were those who believed they were already saved, as if they belonged to that chosen group, and that is why they led a tranquil life, without great complications.

Christ, instead of reducing the response to a numerical question, invites the listeners to take advantage of the time they have available: "Strive to enter through the narrow door" (Luke 13:24). In this way, he hints that in heaven there are no spots limited only to certain privileged ones: it is within everyone's reach, but it requires continuous effort sustained by grace. "Jesus does not want to deceive us by saying: 'Yes, don't worry, it's easy, there is a beautiful road and at the end a great door." He does not tell us this: he speaks to us about the narrow door. He tells us things as they are: the passage is narrow. In what sense? In the sense that to be saved one must love God and one's neighbor, and this is not comfortable! It is a 'narrow door' because it is demanding; love is always demanding, requiring commitment, even more so, 'effort,' that is, a firm and persevering will to live according to the Gospel. Thus, it is not enough to belong to the chosen people or to have heard the teaching of the Lord; it is necessary to respond to his grace.

I want to thank all of you who in any way supported the good success of our festival, may the Good Lord bless all of you. *Remember:*

"God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"


