FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross September 14, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's gospel reflects the interpretation of the cross made by the community of John. According to this text, Jesus is the only one who has come down from heaven to the world sent by God the Father, and has ascended back to heaven in a very peculiar way: through the cross, which lifts him back up to heaven, to the Father.

The Gospel of John, tells us, that looking at the crucified Jesus is to receive the salvation that God gives us. In other words: believing that Jesus is the Son of God and that he was sent for our good fulfills our lives. It frees us from our distrust, fears, and murmurs against God and against others.

Looking at Jesus on the cross is seeing God in the other, the one our Christian vocation is called to attend to and care for. Also, to accept and to seek; the cross is the place of those who are not defended or heard, of those who see how the rest look the other way, who end up abandoned because they have never stopped seeking coherence.

This place is the one that Jesus chooses to lead us to full life from, because it is the place where one can love the most.

Lord God, help us see the redemptive value of suffering. Give us the mindset of Jesus Christ, prepare us to be completely Christian; fully committed to you and your people, even at the cost of suffering. Give us strength to follow the path of your Son. Be always for us, your faithful, our column and anchor, govern our dwelling. May our faith be consolidated in the Cross and may our crown be prepared in it. Amen.


