FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Twenty seventh Sunday in ordinary time

Dear Brothers and sisters,

This weekend the Gospel presents us the mustard seed as the example of faith, and as we see a mustard seed is small and fragile, but it holds within it a silent strength that will make it grow and become a large tree. Similarly, perhaps in our lives we meet many people who are like mustard seeds: simple, humble individuals who do not draw attention, yet whose firm and persevering faith allows them to go through difficult trials without losing hope or love. They do not boast so much about their merits or abilities, for they know that they have received everything from God. Moreover, they limit themselves to saying what Jesus teaches in the Gospel: "We are unworthy servants; we have only done what we ought to have done." Such is the kingdom of God: a humanly small reality, made up of the poor in spirit, of those who do not rely solely on their own strength, but on the love of God, of those who are not important in the eyes of the world; and yet, precisely through them, the power of Christ bursts forth and transforms what is seemingly insignificant.

A man of faith does not seek to impose his own plans on God or force Him to act according to human expectations. He knows that his vision is limited, that his desires may be tainted by sin, and therefore he does not cling to them as if they were absolute, his attitude resembles that of a faithful servant: he remains attentive to the voice of his Lord, ready to obey, to wait, and to act when necessary. He recognizes that his greatness, that everything that gives meaning to his existence, lies in knowing that he is loved and supported by God.

So, faith comparable to a mustard seed is a faith that is neither proud nor self-assured. It is a faith that in its humility feels a great need for God and, in its smallness, completely trusts in Him. It is faith that gives us the ability to look at life's ups and downs with hope, that helps us to accept even defeats and sufferings, knowing that evil never has, and will never have, the last word."


