

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Gospel and the readings for this week, focus on the power of persistent prayer as a key to overcoming the world that is against the Gospel of life. We know that God is the source of life, the sustainer of life, and the giver of eternal life. It is for this reason that we must return to God in daily and uninterrupted prayer.

Select "Safe Environment" at the bottom of the main page. Follow the directions on the left side of the Safe Environment main page.

Every member that is employed by a parish or school and <u>any</u> <u>volunteer working with minors in our archdiocese</u> is required to meet three requirements:

1-Attend a Safe Environment Education Session.

2-Pass a Criminal Background Check.

3-Sign the Code of Ethical Standards.

If you would like to volunteer in the parish and/or school please register for initial Safe Environment Education training. This training will be conducted in person. Please note, no one can register on another's behalf, you must register yourself via CMG Connect.org.
