# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time C

Dear brothers and sisters,

In the gospel of today's Mass, we read a parable of Jesus that contrasts two possible attitudes toward God. Two men went up to the temple to pray: one was a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.

The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed inwardly: 'O God, I thank you that I am not like other men robbers, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector' (Lk 18:10-11). This character is a caricature of the religious man who fulfills God's commands. In his case brilliantly at least that is how he sees it and who therefore thinks that perfection lies in merely following the precepts. He does not feel sinful or indebted to the Lord, and this makes him incapable of experiencing divine mercy or of being merciful himself toward others, whom he judges from the pedestal of his alleged moral superiority.

On the other hand, the tax collector, standing far off, would not even dare to lift his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying: 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner'" (Lk 18:13). Tax collectors held one of the lowest positions in the social ranking of that time. They were despised by Pharisees like the one in the parable and by a considerable part of the population. This only emphasizes even more the power of Jesus' conclusion: 'I tell you, this man went home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted' (Lk 18:14).

Pope Leo XIV has emphasized that, in the Gospel, humility is the fullest form of freedom (cf. Lk 14:11), as it frees us from constantly looking at ourselves and allows us to direct our eyes primarily towards God: "Whoever exalts himself generally seems to have found nothing more interesting than himself and, deep down, has little confidence in himself. But whoever has understood that he is very valuable in the eyes of God, who feels deeply as a son or daughter of God, has greater things to boast about and possesses a dignity that shines on its own.

Remember:

"God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"


