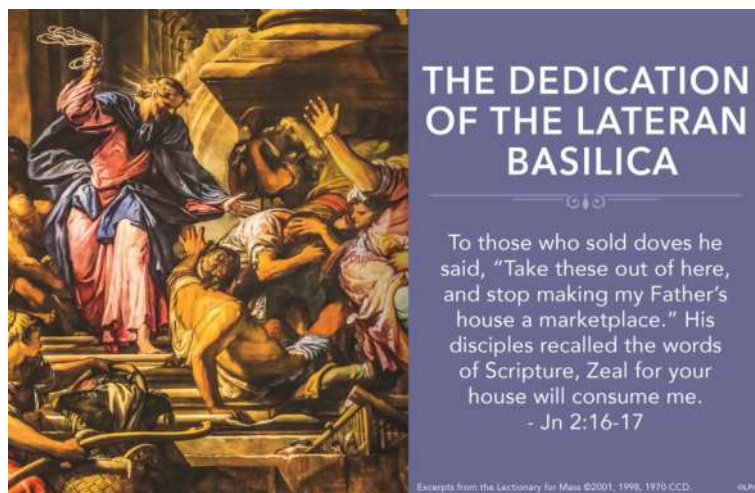

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Dear brothers and sisters,

In the early days of Christianity, the celebration of the Eucharist took place in private homes of some Christian families. These were the early domestic churches, or “domus ecclesiae”. In Rome, the first Christian temple built was the Lateran Basilica, on land previously occupied by a barracks for the emperor's private guard. Pope Sylvester consecrated it in 318. Initially, it was called the Basilica of the Savior, but in medieval times it was also dedicated to Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist. For many centuries, until the Avignon Papacy, the papal throne was located there, and thus this basilica earned the title “cunctarum mater et caput ecclesiarum”, *mother and head of all churches*, which can still be read in an inscription near the entrance.

Today, as we commemorate the dedication of this basilica, it is an occasion to strengthen our communion with the See of Peter and also to deepen our understanding of the significance of sacred buildings; spaces dedicated exclusively to worship in the Christian life.

The visible churches are a symbol of the invisible Church, made up of all the baptized as “living stones chosen by God”. Therefore, on a feast such as today, we ask the Lord that, with His help, we may know how to build up the Church and thus attain our final dwelling place in the heavenly Jerusalem.

St. Paul, writing to the Corinthians, tells us that, as believers, we must be God's collaborators in building up his church, with Jesus Christ as the sole foundation upon which it should be built. But we, those believers, are the temple of God where the Spirit dwells. And therein lies the Church.

To remember and celebrate in this jubilee year the Mother of all churches is to wish all Christians of the world to live in unity and love, all being living stones for the construction of the Church whose temple is Jesus who gives himself for all without distinction of race, people and nation.

Remember,

“God loves you, God loves me, God loves us”
