

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary time C

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the Gospel this Sunday we see Jesus is in the Temple. After contemplating the beauty of its adornments, he turns to his disciples and speaks to them about the time of persecution and the destruction of the Temple and in the midst of this discourse, the Lord intersperses a series of recommendations for facing these events. 'They will seize you and persecute you, handing you over to the synagogues and prisons. Therefore, be convinced that you should not have beforehand a plan of how you are going to defend yourselves' (Luke 21:12-14). This advice might seem a little strange. What's the point of not preparing a defense against unjust persecution? Perhaps Jesus actually wants us to focus less on what we are capable of doing and more on what He can do in us, especially in times of difficulty. "I will give you words and wisdom that none of your adversaries will be able to withstand or contradict" (Luke 21:15), he then says. He confronts us with our limitations so that He can shine in our lives. These are words that can further ignite our faith and hope because they remind us that we are not alone.

Knowing that God is always by our side leads us to live serenely and optimistically. This does not mean, however, that our actions are indifferent, that one decision is the same as another. Christ, to extend His reign in our hearts, counts on what we do and what we are capable of doing. The Gospel, in fact, gives examples of people who collaborated with Jesus through concrete gestures: filling water jars, opening a hole in the roof, offering the loaves and fishes, giving drink to the thirsty stranger... These are details that were within anyone's reach, but which, when put into practice, had an unimaginable result: the best wine, the healing of a paralytic, an abundance of food, or a change of life.

Accepting difficulties with the conviction of someone who knows they are always in God's hands will lead us to live with greater serenity.

Remember,

"God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"


