

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Baptism of the Lord

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the liturgical season of Christmas, but the mysteries of Christ's life, death, and resurrection, which constitute our own Baptism in the Church, continue to unfold.

For Catholics and Christians, the word "baptism" brings to mind the Sacrament of Initiation of the same name. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Holy Baptism is the foundation of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which opens the way to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God; we become members of Christ and are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: 'Baptism is the sacrament of new birth by water and the word' (CCC 1213)."

That wasn't Jesus' experience on the banks of the Jordan River. On that occasion, baptism meant something different. First of all, Jesus didn't need to be baptized. He was and is God and had no sin, and therefore, he didn't need to be forgiven or "freed from sin." Furthermore, he didn't need to make any commitments or vows to participate in the mission of the Church. He was and is its founder. So, what did it mean for him to be baptized by John?

Jesus was baptized by John, who came to "prepare the way," so that Jesus could begin his divine mission of saving from sin all those with whom he now shared in humanity. John's preaching and the waters of the Jordan offered Jesus the public occasion for this. "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29) John proclaimed. The voice of the Father was heard, "This is my beloved Son," "taking the place of sinners" (Joseph Ratzinger/Pope Benedict XVI, "Jesus of Nazareth").
