FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Fourth Sunday in the Ordinary time A

Dear Brothers and sisters,

Have you ever wondered what happiness is? Have you ever wanted to buy happiness? At which store? On which beach? In which nightclub? Have you ever said to yourself, "Today, I was truly happy"? Happiness, joy, for us, are brief flashes, moments, seconds of well-being: a pleasant conversation, a good meal, a child's success, a heartfelt prayer, a trip, etc. We could make an endless list of happy moments. I don't know if we are programmed to be happy, but we all want to be and we search for happiness like crazy.

in today's Gospel, Jesus, the new Moses, climbs the hill, sits down, and begins to teach them, to teach us. The Beatitudes, this sermon is called the Magna Carta and the program for all of Jesus' followers. It is the program for happiness according to Jesus.

You and I don't just want moments of happiness; we want complete happiness, and we want it now, right this minute. Is that possible? I don't know what happiness is, but I know what a happy man is.

I know happy men and women in our community. Happiness despite illness, despite financial hardship, despite everything. They are happy because God is their source of holiness and happiness. It is a blessing to know that there are happy people in our community, for it is a sign that they take the Gospel of Jesus seriously. Jesus went up the hillside, sat down, surrounded by his disciples, and began to teach them: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, the meek, those who mourn, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, those who are persecuted." This program of happiness from Jesus is an affirmation of our life, our world, and our situation. Jesus sees the poor, the oppressed, the dispossessed, the despised... Jesus knows that evil exists, that slavery exists, that the greed of a few impoverishes many. Jesus knows that God does not like this and does not want it.

Jesus tells us today, all of us who feel that we are on the side of the losers according to the world, of those who are considered insignificant for others or feel rejected: that you can rejoice and be glad, because you are counted with the blessed ones and The Kingdom of God is yours.

Remember,

"God loves you, God loves me, God loves us"

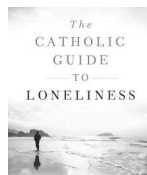

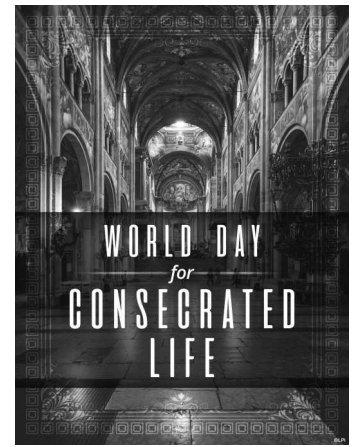
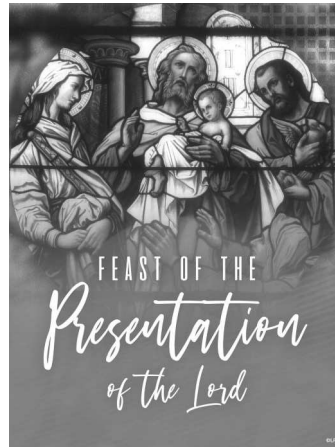
