WHAT is RCIA and **WHO** is it for?

RCIA is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a process used by Catholic parishes to welcome and prepare adults who are interested in becoming Catholic or exploring whether or not the Catholic faith is for them (or baptized Catholic, but not yet Confirmed). It is a journey of faith in community, during which information about the Catholic faith is shared and the drawing of one's heart closer to God are joined to help the person live a fuller Christian life.

WHEN and **WHERE** is RCIA?

We meet primarily Sunday mornings from 8:45 - 10:45 a.m. from mid-September through April. Classes are held in the lower level of the church in the Magi/Shepherd Room. If the participant chooses to complete the process and is ready, they generally join the Church and receive their Sacraments at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening.

WHY should I begin RCIA?

To learn more about the Catholic faith, receive the Sacraments, draw closer to Christ in community and find greater peace, joy and strength for the journey.
