The Coming of Christ

Advent is our time of anticipation: We await the two comings of Christ, the one in time, the other at the end of time. Today's second reading and gospel refer to the latter of these, a day of deliverance for the faithful, a day of judgment for others.

The first reading, though, presents the last days differently. All nations have accepted God's rule and obey God's law, therefore weapons disappear and peace reigns. We ought to strive to see this vision of the end realized.

There is no call for fiery judgment when all people walk God's path. The eucharist gives us strength to do this, and also binds us into the unity which is the ultimate end of God's history.

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The prickly leaves remind us of the crown of thorns. The circle of the wreath which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ.

The four candles represent the 4 weeks of Advent. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time.

The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday. This is a Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead. The light signifies Christ, the Light of the world.

Contact Gov. Pritzker asking him to VETO SB 1950

As you know, life is sacred from conception to natural death and assisted suicide violates that basic tenet of Church teaching, making it morally unacceptable. The Church also calls us to protect the sick, vulnerable and marginalized of our society. In states where this is legal, physician assisted suicide incentivizes insurance companies to deny lifesaving treatment while offering cheaper lethal drugs; marginalized communities fear coercion and abuse of such a system, and suicide promotion and contagion are real. Assisted suicide in practice is also at odds with the physician's responsibility to care for patients.

When you request a veto for this bill, morally acceptable suggestions include: encouraging & supporting more hospice and palliative care programs & providing education concerning advanced directives and end of life options.
