| 5 Minutes | Prayers of gratitude (not petition) |
| 30-45 Minutes | Follow the Formation Guidelines from the Formation Book, relating the teaching to our own lives, struggles and spiritual walk |
| 15 Minutes | Prayers of Petition |
| 10 Minutes | The Divine Mercy Chaplet |
| 30-45 Minutes | Optional Social Time/Fellowship |

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OUR MISSION:

1. To profess and proclaim the truth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist, and to promote, insofar as possible, Perpetual Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament and the hourly offering of the The Divine Mercy Chaplet for the dying.
