SCHOOL GROUNDS UPDATE

In the Fall and Winter of 2020-2021, landslides on the hill bordering the upper playground and soccer field progressed into the blacktop area and began to damage the playground fence. As a safety precaution, in the summer of 2021, we installed new fencing to block the slide area from the playground. We consulted with the Diocese Building & Facilities department, and they determined that an engineering firm should be hired to assess the situation and recommend solutions. A generous benefactor of the school stepped in to pay for the engineering work. The results of the study have determined that a large NKY Water District pipe crosses the playground and soccer field near the slide area. The pipe is marked “abandoned” on their maps, but the engineers believe this potentially contributed to the landslide. The Diocese is now consulting with the Water District to arrive at a solution. We will keep you informed as we have new information available.

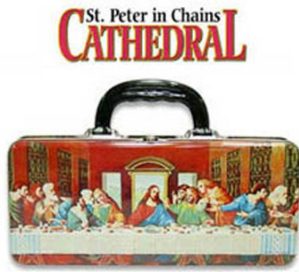

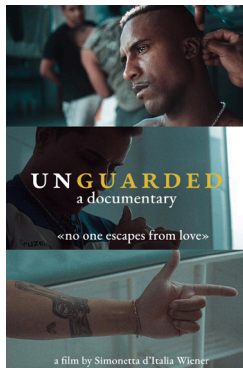
