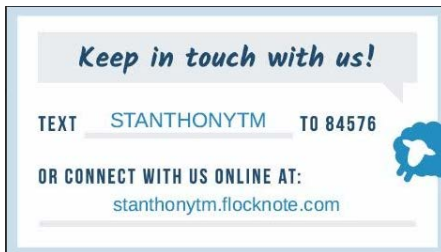

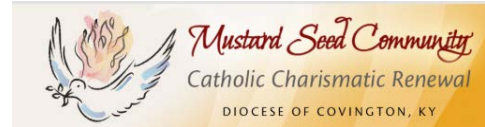


**BIKE DONATIONS NEEDED FOR PICKETT'S CORNER –
