Blair Thompson and Steve Heidrich are potential nominees.

Anita will be the nominee if she hasn't been honored yet, otherwise it will be Rita Jackson (Tobias will check; Update: Anita was indeed honored), together with Blair Thompson.

Fr. Ivan will be gone 11/20-12/8, so the Appreciation Dinner will not be held on the second Monday of the month, per usual, but rather on the following Monday, December 15 at 6 pm.

### Advent and December Schedule

The Tuesday penance service has been moved from 12/9 to **December 16 at 7 pm**, in light of the fact that Fr. Ivan will be out of the country until 12/8.

On 12/26, Friday there will be our regular 8 am Mass. On 12/27, the Saturday evening Mass will be in honor of the Holy Family, just as the 8 am and 10 am on Sunday, 12/28.

Pete Manczyk will be sending to the parish council and Becki the finalized version of the schedule.

### Fr. Ivan's Closing Comments

One question is whether a Resource Officer should be hired (estimated cost, \$100k/year) at our parish and other parishes in the diocese. Or – to what extent should parishioners be identified as security personnel in one fashion or another? This is an ongoing discussion.

The Church Renovation Phase 1 is almost done. The two sacristies are yet to be painted and tiled. When they are done, that should complete phase 1.

Phase 2 will be mostly furnishings and the reredos. The windows await to be changed/replaced. Fr. Ivan has replaced the previous statue of Mary – now in the school – with another in the parish. The corresponding statute of Jesus will eventually be placed by the confessional, while a St. Joseph statue takes its place up front.

Proposals for Phase 2 still need to be made to and accepted by the Worship Committee of the Diocese.

The Gym discussion has resurfaced because St. Joseph the Worker is no longer in the picture. St. Anthony's is again at the forefront of Paul Naberhaus' financial considerations.

The quote Paul Naberhaus received for a new gym is now over \$1.5 million, but he believes with a few cuts he can get it done for \$1,380,000. He is willing to go halfway if we can come up with over 700k to match.

But if St. Anthony's can't afford it, Paul is willing to put up to \$750k toward a different project at St. Anthony's. One consideration involves improving the soccer field while adding volleyball courts.

Another suggestion, proffered by Fr. Ivan, is to have Holy Cross and their affiliates go in on the gym price under the precondition that they use the facility for wrestling, etc., as they are currently requesting the use of Fleming Hall. The difference that St. Anthony's would have to contribute financially would then be considerably less.
