Dear Friends,

I want to begin by thanking all of you – from our staff members at our parishes and school to all of the volunteers who work so hard to help our cluster thrive. Jesus Is Coming to You!

Shortly after his Resurrection, Jesus accompanied two disciples on their journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus walking with them in their grief, offering hope, and finally revealing himself through the breaking of the bread. Jesus wants to do the same for YOU!

This will be one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history. Just as throngs followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry, our nation will process with our Eucharistic Lord through cities, along highways, and past rural towns on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress.

Marian Route

Departing from the headwaters of the Mississippi, the northern arm of the Pilgrimage will descend through the midwestern United States, pass through Wisconsin and Illinois, and meet up with the other three Pilgrimage routes in Indianapolis at the 10th National Eucharistic Congress.

This route may be the shortest in distance, but it has no shortage of opportunities for encounter with Christ! Pilgrims will attend Mass every day of their journey, along with regular evenings of reflection and adoration. As they travel, pilgrims will grow closer to Our Lord through service to local communities, inviting the most marginalized among us to be revived by the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Society of Saint Vincent de Paul

Our main objective as a St. Vincent DePaul (SVdP) conference is to encourage our members to grow in holiness, community, and service; with the spiritual growth of the members as the primary goal. Much of this happens when we join together at our meetings and through our service.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is an international organization and is divided into geographic areas. Our conferences serve in our local communities. There are two types of SVdP volunteer members: active and associate. Active members are Catholic, attend meetings regularly, and participate in the activities of our conference. An associate member does not need to be Catholic nor attend meetings, but assists with the activities of the conference. *You could consider joining individually or as a couple or with a friend.*

SVdP serves the poor and encourages people to climb out of poverty. One of the ways we accomplish this is through education. Throughout the year, we hear speakers at our meetings to help us understand poverty and better prepare us to support our neighbors in need. After training, an active member receives calls from the SVdP crisis call center in Sheboygan or Ozaukee counties and contacts our neighbor in need and discusses his/her request. SVdP will help pay rent, utilities, or provide food, gasoline, or vouchers to the SVdP store for clothing, furniture, or household items. We share additional community contacts with our neighbors in need so they can get back on their feet. After the initial phone call, two members make a home visit to show loving support and kindness to our neighbor in need.

St. Vincent de Paul operates stores at 4215 Highway 42, Sheboygan, and at 2673 Hwy C, Port Washington. Donations of clothes, furniture, toys, sports equipment, tools, garden supplies, dishes, and household materials result in sales with profits which are transferred to conferences like ours. We use them to help pay rent, utilities, and food for our neighbors in need within our counties. The stores depend on volunteers and could use your help. *If you can help, please call the stores.*

This is an opportunity to grow in holiness. We find the home visits are mutually rewarding. *Would you consider becoming an active St. Vincent de Paul member who can make home visits? If you aspire to make a positive difference, please call Rose Vander Velden at 920-627-1713 (OLL) or Carol Pomeday at 920-889-6161 (DS) to learn about becoming a Vincentian.*
