In these final months of 2025, we will close out the Jubilee Year of Hope that was instituted by the late Pope Francis last winter. It is a great time to think about how we can continue to be Beacons of Hope in our broken world that is so hungry for the love, mercy, compassion, healing and forgiveness of Christ.



Baptism Class: If you are a new parent or expecting a child, and it has been three years since your last child was baptized, you need to take a class before having your child baptized. Consider taking the class while you are pregnant. Contact Deb Hamm to set up a class.

BAPTISM FOR AN OLDER CHILD: If you have a child younger than second grade who has not yet been baptized and you want them to receive First Communion in second grade, you must have your child baptized before their first day of Second Grade. Contact Deb Hamm for details. After the first day of second grade, an unbaptized child needs to go through a lengthy preparation period and they then receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion all at one time.

Hospital Visits: Please remember if you or an immediate family member is hospitalized and you'd like the parish to know, you should call your parish office. The privacy laws make it very difficult for us to know if someone is in the hospital. Even if someone at the hospital says they will notify your parish, they don't always do so.

Lisbon Creek will also be doing that work. It will take several months for that work to take place. We are also getting bids on safety cameras at Holy Cross Chapel (St. Rose and DSCS already have safety cameras). Financing for these projects came out of the Love One Another Campaign donations. Thank you again for your continued generosity.

We need your help! We have to install a new septic system at Holy Cross Chapel. As part of the project, a new filter bed will be installed between the east end of the chapel and the farm field. Thanks to all those who have donated, we have been able to reach 53% of our goal.

We cannot use Love One Another (LOA) money for this project because that money was earmarked for specific projects. The three remaining projects under LOA funding are the Audio Visual upgrades (coming soon), the Holy Cross parking lot and to enhance our parish ministries.

We are deeply grateful to all of you who give so generously of your time, talent and treasure. We could not continue to operate without your help.

Our giving categories in both parishes are quite similar. Did you know that close to 60% of our registered parishioners contribute to our parishes?

Fifteen percent of our parishioners give between \$1001 and \$2000, which is the most popular range. Four percent give at least \$10,000.

Nearly 40% of our registered parishioners give no financial support to our parish.
