


Divine Savior Catholic School

Where does your school tuition go?

Divine Savior Catholic School offers grades K3 - 8th. Our school is an accredited Milwaukee Archdiocesan Catholic School and we are committed to developing strong Christian values and faith enrichment. We teach a balanced curriculum and good study habits that will build sound life skills and a positive self-image.



Divine Savior Catholic School tuition is the same for all students regardless of faith or parish affiliation.

1st Child: \$2,200 = \$12.22 per day
2nd Child: \$2,000 = \$11.11 per day
3rd Child: \$1,900 = \$10.56 per day

Beyond the school day, extended morning and after school care is offered to all DSCS students. Extended care is not available during the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, school curriculum continues through distance learning (see below).

Tuition has remained low due to the generosity of our parish cluster. Divine Savior Parish and Our Lady of the Lakes Parish subsidizes approximately 35% of the school's operational costs. Generous community grants, parishioner donations and fundraising helps provide the school with the latest technology and building upgrades. Divine Savior Catholic School strives to be fiscally responsible with every dollar received.

Distance Learning

Divine Savior Catholic School has been able to offer continued instruction for our students in grades 3K-8th grade. Despite the COVID-19 Pandemic, we have provided our students with quality educational experiences and will continue to do so for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year.

All teachers grades 3K-8, as well as our specialty teachers, have established methods to deliver instruction to their students. Our teachers have utilized SeeSaw, Zoom, Google Meets and more to stay connected with students and families. Many teachers have been recording videos for lessons, holding classroom meetings, meeting separately with students and utilizing Google Classroom. All of these methods have allowed us to stay connected to our students.

As a school we chose to centrally locate all teacher assignments and information. [A Distance Learning Website](#) was created to allow parents to easily access weekly work. The website also provides connections to our Catholic faith such as Rosary videos, meditation videos, the Divine Mercy Chaplet and more.

Teachers have made it clear to all of their students and parents that they are there to help and support their students' education. Teachers have been making copies, mailing information, providing reading materials, preparing projects and packets and having it all available for pick-up at the school. School supplies and materials have been offered to families and have been made available upon request. Technology devices have been provided for families who have requested a need for them.

Morning prayer and announcements are recorded and sent out each day for our students and families. This has been a good way to keep things as normal as possible during these unprecedented times. We continue to deliver our weekly newsletter to help keep families informed. We have also held several spirit day activities to help keep morale high.

The teachers are working tirelessly to keep up with this new format. They are not distance learning teachers; however, they have made the switch to this format in order to continue serving you and your family. It takes countless hours to prepare for virtual lessons, to correct papers and give valid feedback and to meet the needs of all of the students in a class. In many cases our DSCS teachers are putting in more hours than ever before. Keeping in mind, many of them have their own families at home who are also in need of their attention.
