2023 SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

SCHOOL THEME:

Our theme for this school year is: God Fills Our Hearts. Each month we highlight a new way that God does this for us. During the month of September we were focused on the LOVE that God fills our hearts with. During October our focus was on KINDNESS. In November we looked at the ways God fills our hearts with GRATITUDE. Our hearts will also be filled this year with Joy, Hope, Forgiveness, Faithfulness, Compassion and Patience.

ACCREDITATION:

October 11th and 12th were busy days for our DSCS staff. We had our Accreditation visit. This visit helped us to showcase the very best of Divine Savior Catholic School. The visiting team spent two days with our students and staff. Their job was to review our evidence to see if our policies and procedures were in alignment with the National Benchmarks and Standards. Our staff worked very hard during the 18 months prior to the visit collecting the evidence we needed. The visit went very well, and the visiting team had lots of wonderful things to say about our school. We will now use the feedback the team has provided to set goals for DSCS for the next seven years.

COMMUNITY CARES PROGRAM:

We have partnered with Community Cares Programs to bring support to some of our students. This partnership will help us meet the mental health needs of our students who may be struggling with big emotions. Our focus will be on addressing anxiety, stress and dealing effectively with anger. So far, it is going very well. We have applied for a grant to help us continue this vital program.

FOUNTAS & PINNELL GUIDED READING BOOKS-CATHOLIC COMMUNITY FOUNDATION:

DSCS got some AMAZING news last January. We applied for a grant to help add more book sets to our new reading series, and in January we learned that we had been awarded a grant from *The Catholic Community Foundation* for \$10,600. We are beyond thrilled to have received this grant! The Catholic Community Foundation is a true blessing to our students and staff.

BRUCE KRIER MATH & SCIENCE GRANT:

We had some BIG news to end our school year with last May! DSCS received a \$52,851 grant from the Bruce Krier Foundation. This grant will support our new math & science programs. We are so excited to be able to replace our outdated materials. These new materials are better suited to the way we teach math and science. This will allow all of our students to excel personally and academically.





CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WALK:

On Saturday, October 14th, we had our 3rd annual local Catholic Schools Walk. This year our theme was "Come Follow Me." The walk highlighted leaders of our faith, both near and far. Our middle school students even interviewed some of our own faith leaders and created posters to emphasize their contributions. It was a great day to focus on Catholic education at DSCS.

DIGITAL SIGN GRANT:

In April we applied for a GIFTS Grant from the Archdiocese Schools Office. This grant was to help us replace our information sign in the front of school with a digital one. WE GOT IT! It was a \$10,000 grant. We were also able to raise the remaining funds to replace the sign, and it was installed this December. We are so excited to be able to market the school & cluster parish, and to use the sign to evangelize.

DIGITAL MAPPING SAFETY GRANT/ SCHOOL SAFETY:

I am happy to announce that Divine Savior Catholic School received a DOJ grant for \$8,000 to have our school digitally mapped. This will allow for critical incident mapping data to help enhance the security of our school building, as well as our reunification site. These digital maps will be able to increase situational awareness for first responders in the event of an emergency at our school. The safety of our students and staff is our number one priority, and this grant will help us to be more prepared.


PLAY BASED LEARNING GRANT:

We have more great news to share from DSCS! Our early childhood team and I submitted a GIFTS grant through the Milwaukee Archdiocese. We were awarded the grant and were able to spend \$5,000 to purchase new equipment for our 3K, 4K and 5K classrooms. It also provided money for teacher training to help grow our play-based learning model. What a great blessing for our students and staff.

LONG RANGE GOALS:

DSCS works hard to plan for the future. The following are our highlighted goals:

- Continue to grow enrollment.
- A commitment to meeting the mental health needs of our students.
- Implementing the Conscious Discipline model to help build resilient classrooms.
- Updating our playground for safety and functionality.
- Increase teacher and support staff salaries to help retain quality educators.




ACTUAL COST TO EDUCATE A CHILD: \$6,753.00

BAND




OUR MISSION STATEMENT
