Mission Statement

Principal Report- Advisory Commission – May 8th, 2023 WCSA Goals Update

- 3.2 (current goal) Through the accreditation process it became clear that we offer numerous spiritual experiences for our students; however, we do not offer organized retreats. It is a goal of DSCS to offer planned and organized religious retreats for students. 3.2 was a benchmark that was met, but we would like to improve upon this to better enhance the spiritual experiences offered to our students.
- 4.2 (Current goal) We have noted that only a small number of our school families attend Sunday Mass on a regular basis. 4.2 was a benchmark that was met, but we would like to improve upon this to better support our parents as the primary educators of their children in faith.
- 5.6 (Current goal) We have an established Education Committee, a supportive Parish Council, and a well organized Learning Support Team. Improvements can be made in training, formation, and self-evaluation of committee members.
- 7.3 (current goal) Through the Accreditation process it became clear that we do not have a formal curriculum review process that includes21st century learning skills and what they look like in each grade level and subject.
- 8.4 (current goal) It has become clear that we need to provide regular opportunities for faculty to validate assessments for reliability and provide professional development for faculty and professional staff on how to differentiate assessments to measure learning.
- 13.2 (Current goal) We do not have a formal enrollment management plan.

Accreditation Self-Study

- We have currently scored all of the standards. Our work continues collecting the evidence we need to support our scores. This evidence will be reviewed by the Accreditation visiting team.
- Our Visit will happen October 11th & 12th, 2023
- Mrs. Malueg continues to build the website that will hold all of our evidence for accreditation.

Academics

- We are waiting to hear back about our Math and Science grant. We should know later this month.
- Iowa Basic testing results are back. We will review them as a staff and results will be sent home with report cards.
- Our Aims testing window begins this week.



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• This summer we will be offering tutoring to students who have been identified by teachers as needing extra help and support.

Staff Professional Learning Community (PLC):

- Our current staff initiatives are: Mindfulness for students and staff, standards based grading and aligning assessments to the standards, curriculum work, providing varied faith and prayer experiences for all of our students, Emergency Operations Plan work and Community Connections
- Several teachers attended the Wisconsin Mathematics Council Conference in Green Lake We look forward to hearing what they learned.

Building & Grounds

- Tim Dubey has been managing the small projects around the building and keeping things in good order. There are no major projects right now. We are working on our summer to-do list.
- We will be looking at what improvements we can make to the playground with the money that has been raised from the Day of Giving and from the Catholic Schools Walk. I am working on putting a committee together. We should have about \$10,000 to use to add some playground updates. We have a meeting on May 10th to discuss next steps.
- We wrote for a grant to help replace our sign in the front of school with a digital one. It is a GIFTS grant from the Archdiocese for \$10,000. We will know if we get the grant in June. More money will need to be raised.

Personnel

- We are in need of a part-time staff member for our extended day program.
- We are looking for a part-time cleaner.

School Safety

- We will be holding two fire drills this month.
- We had our tornado drill on April 21st. All went well.
- DSCS has received a DOJ grant for \$8,000 to have our school digitally mapped. We are in the final review process of the floor plans.
- We have partnered with Community Cares Programs to bring some support to our students. This partnership will help us meet the mental health needs of our students who may be struggling with big emotions. Our focus will be on addressing anxiety, stress & dealing effectively with anger. So far, it is going very well.

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
