


2025 SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

SCHOOL THEME:

Our theme this year is Let Your Light Shine. Each month we will focus on a different virtue or trait that will help us to let the light of Christ shine in our lives, in our school and in the world. During the month of September, we let our lights shine with Patience. In October we worked on Respect, and in November we were shining with Generosity. During December, we let our light shine with Joy, and in January we used Self-Control. We will also be working on Forgiveness, Evangelization, Responsibility and Prayer. We are definitely looking forward to a bright school year at DSCS!

Bruce Krier Safety Grant:

Divine Savior Catholic School was blessed to be the recipient of another generous Bruce Krier Grant. This grant allowed us to update our flooring in many of the classrooms on our main level. We were able to take out the old flooring that was in disrepair and replace it with brand new laminate flooring and carpet. It has helped us to create a wonderful, safe and healthy learning environment for our students and teachers! We were also able to purchase new tables for our lunchroom. These new lunch tables can be easily moved for cleaning purposes and have made such a difference for our students and staff. The grant also allowed us to replace our Stop the Bleed kits and add an AED to our second floor. Thanks to the Bruce Krier Foundation, DSCS has been able to become a safer and healthier place to learn and grow!



Catholic Community Foundation Grant:

DSCS also received a grant from the Catholic Community Foundation to help support tuition assistance and special programming for our students. One such program, that has now entered its third year, is our Community Cares Therapy Program. DSCS offers this to students who are struggling to properly manage their anger or anxiety. Our therapists work with several students in a small group setting to help them learn more about self-regulation skills.



Love One Another Grants:

The Love One Another Grant program has blessed DSCS with new safety doors in our office. These doors were installed this summer. A safety assessment noted a need for a secure entrance in our school office. The recommendation was to install interior doors with crash bars, as well as a buzz in system. These new doors have now been installed between our school and parish offices and the entrance to the school building. They now allow our office staff to control admittance, limiting the risk of unauthorized visitors.

We were also given a Love One Another Grant to purchase new Bibles and developmentally appropriate scriptural materials for our classrooms. This has helped to strengthen Catholic education at DSCS by ensuring that we have the best materials available to learn more about the Word of God. Making scripture a top priority in our classrooms, from 3K-8th grade, has had a positive impact on the students' scriptural knowledge, and has helped our students and staff better integrate scripture into our classrooms and daily lives.



LONG RANGE GOALS:

DSCS works hard to plan for the future.

- Continue to grow enrollment.
- A commitment to meeting the mental health needs of our students.
- Implementing the Conscious Discipline model to help build resilient classrooms.
- Increase teacher and support staff salaries to help retain quality educators.




ACTUAL COST TO EDUCATE A CHILD: \$7,390.00
