Cascade Catholic Church To Celebrate Jubilee With Solemn High Mass And Brief Program

Cascade, Wis.—The congregation of St. Mary's Catholic church here will celebrate the Diamond Jubilee next Sunday. The ceremonies will begin with a Solemn High Mass at 10:30 a. m. with the following priests taking part: the Rev. William Ogle of Harrisburg, Ohio, celebrant; the Rev. Henry Riordan of St. Joseph's, Fond du Lac, deacon; the Rev. Cyril Donohue, S. J., of Marquette university, sub-deacon; Rev. David Regan of St. Joseph's, Berlin, will preach the sermon, and Rev. Leo Schiffler of St. Veronica's, Milwaukee will act as master of ceremonies.

During the afternoon, a short program will be presented and C. E. Broughton, editor of The Sheboygan Press, will be the principal speaker.

A picnic, in connection with the Jubilee, will be held on the grounds of St. Mary's hall in charge of the

ST. MARY'S CHURCH, CASCADE

St. Mary's congregation at Cascade, town of Lyndon, was established in 1859, after which time it was attended successively by the Revs. Father Francis Fusseder, Patrick F. Petit, Patrick Bradley, James McGowan, Henry McMahon, John Tiernan, E. J. Goss, Dennis Tierney, Thomas Maher, M. Dedecus, John Casey and Bernard J. Burke. The present pastor is Rev. J. H. Fischer. In 1893 a new church was built and dedicated November 22d of that year, the dedicatory services being conducted by the Most Rev. F. X. Katzer. The church was built at a cost of \$10,000. The congregation consists of about fifty-six families.

In 1886 the St. Mary rectory burned to the ground, destroying many of the parish records.

In 1996, Fr. Cerpich began serving St. Mary Random Lake, St. Patrick Adell, and St. Nicholas Dacada. On July 1, 1998, St. Mary in Random Lake, St. Nicholas in Dacada, St. Mary in Cascade, and St. Patrick in Adell merged to form Our Lady of the Lakes in Random Lake.

In June of 2005, Rev. Richard J. Cerpich (St. Mary's last resident pastor) retired, and St. Mary's Chapel in Cascade was closed. Later, the buildings in Cascade were sold.
