
Sunday of the Divine Mercy





Parish Mission Statement: In the spirit of our patron, St. Francis of Assisi, we dedicate ourselves as living stones to building our parish family with Christ as our foundation. Sacraments:

Baptism: Arrangements must be made in advance. Please call the Parish Office to arrange a date and supply pertinent information. Individual Baptismal preparation is required.

Sponsors: must receive from their respective Catholic pastors a "sponsor certificate," which is the signed word of one priest to another that the proposed godparent is a Confirmed, fully-practicing Catholic who is qualified to be a godparent by living in harmony with our faith.

Reconciliation: Saturday from 3:15PM to 3:40PM or call the rectory for an appointment.

First Eucharist & Confirmation: Preparation – two years prior to receiving each Sacrament is mandatory as a registered student in the Faith Formation Program.

Matrimony: Couples are asked to consult with our priest at least six months in advance of the intended date to allow time for marriage preparation, including the Diocesan Program.

Ministry to the Sick: Please notify us if someone you know is homebound and would like to be added to our Communion call list, or would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

Low gluten hosts available: Please let us know before Mass if you have a need to receive this type of host.



Divine Mercy Sunday April 8, 2018



Sat., April 7 - The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated at the 4:00 p.m. Mass.

Sun., April 8 - Grades 6 & 7 class after the 9:30 a.m. Mass until 11:30 a.m. The **First Holy Communion retreat day** will take place following the 11:00 a.m. Mass until about 3:00 p.m. At least one parent is required to stay for the retreat day with their child.

Tues., April 10 - Grades 3, 4 & 5 from 4:30 –5:30 p.m. *This is their last class of the year.

Thurs., April 12 - Grades 1 & 2 from 4:30 - 5:30 p.m.

Thurs., April 26 - Grades 1 & 2 from 4:30 - 5:30 p.m.

Sun., April 29 - Grades 6 & 7 class after the 9:30 a.m. Mass until 11:30 a.m.

All our parish youth, grades 6 through 12, are cordially invited to attend the youth group "meeting" on Sunday,



Pope John Paul II The Great Mercy Pope

Pope John Paul II, both in his teaching and personal life, strove to live and teach the message of Divine Mercy. As the great Mercy Pope, he wrote an encyclical on Divine Mercy:

"The Message of Divine Mercy has always been near and dear to me... which I took with me to the See of Peter and which it in a sense forms the image of this Pontificate."

In his writings and homilies, he has described Divine Mercy as the answer to the world's problems and the message of the third millennium. He beatified and canonized Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska, the nun associated with the message, and



he did it in Rome and not in Poland to underscore that Divine Mercy is for the whole world.

Establishing Divine Mercy Sunday for the Entire Church

When Pope John Paul canonized Sr. Faustina (making her St. Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday (the feast day associated with the message) as a feast day for the entire Church. The feast day falls on the Second Sunday of the Easter season. On that day, Pope John Paul II declared, "This is the happiest day of my life."
