

DONATING TO ST. JOAN OF ARC IN YOUR WILL OR TRUST

The Tribunal Office of the Diocese of St. Petersburg administers all diocesan estates and trusts in accordance with diocesan policy and procedures. As corporation sole and in accordance with canon law, the bishop is the recipient and administrator of all bequests made to the diocese and any diocesan entities.

There can be many advantages to leaving a gift in this way. Naming a parish, school or diocesan entity in your will, trust or as a beneficiary on a life insurance policy is a way for any parishioner to bless future generations through a legacy gift and support the ministry of the church. The parish, school or diocesan entity also benefit immensely by getting more money than they would otherwise if tax deductions had to be taken into consideration. This gift is a living reminder left by individuals and/or families that will continue to support the causes they believe in for years to come. Any donor can plan a legacy gift regardless of current assets or income.

There are basically two kinds of gifts that most people need to be concerned with. They are residuary bequests and pecuniary (specific) bequests. Pecuniary bequests are the more common for most people. It means that you specify a certain amount that will be given, or you can specify various amounts to be given to several entities.

Residuary bequests are in many ways the easier to make. It means that after you have allotted certain amounts to family members and friends, and whoever else you wish to be considered in your will, whatever is left over will go to a stated entity of your choice. There may be very little left over, or there may be disproportionately too much. However, you do have a choice of how you can distribute money through making legacy gifts.

You may also consider naming a parish, school or diocesan entity as the beneficiary on one of your life insurance policies or IRA account or adding as a contingent or percentage beneficiary to an existing policy or IRA.

To observe the best method for naming a parish and or school in your will or trust, please ask your attorney to use the following terminology:

"I give, devise, and bequeath (amount, article, stock, etc.) to Gregory L. Parkes, as Bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg, and his successors in office, a Corporation Sole, for the use of (insert name and address of the parish, school, etc.)." There are three settings in which the family prayer can take place. First is the personal setting. In this setting family members pray to God on their own. For example a father can pray on his way to work. A mother may pray over her sick baby. A boy or girl may pray before going to bed. We can pray set prayers like the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be. We can reflect on these words as we go. We can pray in our own words speaking to God freely from the heart.

The second family prayer setting is in a group. In this setting the family members pray together. They will pray around the table at meal times. These are some of the ways my family prayed. I remember seeing my mother and father praying before Mass began. During WW11 when dad was in the Navy, he said that when he was on a naval ship, he would pray the rosary every day. Mom told my brothers and myself that we should pray the Act of Contrition every night before going to bed. Then if something happened to us in the middle of the night and we died, we would go straight to heaven. I would pray before I had a major test to take at school. I also prayed for my brother when he was in the hospital with meningitis. There were other types of prayer we prayed as a family. We would say grace before and after meals. We also went to Church as a family. If one of my four brothers were sick we would go to Church in shifts. Some of us would go with mom, the others would go with dad on Christmas Eve, my dad would read us the story of the birth of Jesus from the bible.

As we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family we can realize that Jesus Mary and Joseph had difficult times and would naturally turn to God for prayer. A retreat master was making this point when the talked to a group of fathers. He ended by saying, "Joseph is the perfect model for all of us." After the talk a father came up to the retreat master and said: "With all due respect Padre, Joseph's situation was totally different from that of us ordinary fathers. First He was a saint. Second, his wife was sinless, and my son's not the son of God. The retreat master responded: "What you say is true, but let me ask you something in all seriousness. Did your wife become pregnant just before your marriage and you didn't know by whom? Or did your son ever leave home for three days and you didn't know where he was? Both of these things happened to Joseph." The point to the retreat master was perfectly clear. Not even the holiest family is immune from suffering. Now I would like to end with a poem to help us turn to God during difficult times: For every pain we must bear, for every burden every care there's a reason. For every grief that bows the head, for every teardrop that is shed, there is a reason. For every hurt, for every plight for every lonely pain-racked night there is a reason. But if we trust God, as we should, it will turnout for the good. He knows the reason."
