

Father Pat's Gospel Reflection

Fr. Frank Roof is a former chaplain of the Kentucky State Penitentiary. He tells a story about a prisoner named Paul Kordenbrock. Paul was born in Ft. Thomas Kentucky just south of Cincinnati on the Ohio River. Paul Kordenbrock grew up in the 1960's where the philosophy was, "If it feels good, do it." This philosophy led him into one bad situation after another, committing one crime after another. He is now in prison on death row because he was found guilty of killing another person.

Paul Kordenbrick now lives today two floors above the electric chair. In 1982 Paul was introduced to Fr. Roof. He asked Fr. Roof to hear his Confession and bring him Holy Communion. This meeting led to other meetings. Paul was introduced to other Catholic prisoners on death row.

As time passed Paul petitioned prisoner officials to permit Fr. Roof to celebrate Mass for the Catholic prisoners on death row. This permission was given and Fr. Rood began celebrating weekly Masses in a steel cage for the inmates on death row. This was not an accident. Fr. Rood learned that Paul Kodrdenbrock was taking correspondence courses in his faith. These included courses in the Old Testament, New Testament, Church history, and Catholic morals.

Paul became a certified catechist for the diocese of Covington Kentucky. He was now conducting an RCIA program. This is a year-long program. Each year since 1982 Paul has brought in at least one condemned prisoner to Christ. This program is for initiating adults into the Catholic faith on death-row.

Fr. Rood asked Paul how he accounted for his change of heart. Paul attributed his personal transformation to four basic things. The first was letting go of the stuff that bothered him. The second thing was meditating daily. The third thing was reading daily scripture. Finally he said that sharing with other prisoners the story of how Jesus Christ changed his life.

The story of Paul Kordenbrock is similar to the Gospel story of the woman at the well. It is a story of how a sinner met Jesus Christ. Like Paul, the woman at the well was totally changed by the meeting. To appreciate the change Paul went through we can ask ourselves these questions. Like Paul do we meditate daily? Do we also read Scripture daily? Do we also share the story of what Jesus Christ has done for us?

There is also the second way Paul's story resembles the story of the woman at the well. To do this we need to recall what the woman did after her encounter with Jesus at the well. The Gospel states: "The woman left her water jar and went into town and said to the people, 'Come and see a man who told me everything I have done.' "Then the people left the town to meet Jesus. The woman who had been a great sinner became Christianity's first missionary. After she discovered Jesus, she went off to share her discovery with her friends and neighbors. This is exactly what Paul Kordenbrock did. After he discovered Jesus he went off to share his discovery with his fellow inmates. Paul said to them, "Come meet a man who has done marvelous things for me. Paul who had been a great sinner becomes death row's first missionary in the Kentucky State **Penitentiary. To appreciate Paul Kordenbrock's missionary activity we can ask ourselves one question. How many of us have personally**

instructed and brought into the Church at least one person since 1982?

Both stories of Paul and the woman at the well illustrate an important truth. When we let Jesus Christ into our lives remarkable things can to happen. Jesus can change our lives just as radically as He changed the lives of the woman at the well and the man on death row. Through us Jesus can reach out and change the lives of others, like we see in today's Gospel as well as in the story of the man on death row. Jesus is as alive today as he was 2,000

years ago when he changed the life of the woman at the well.

This is what the season of Lent is all about. It is about opening our hearts and letting Jesus into our lives. It is about opening our hearts and letting Jesus change our lives for the better like we see in today's Gospel as well as the man on death row. When this occurs Jesus can work miracles through us. This is the message we see in the story of the woman at the well. This is the message we see in the story of Paul on death row.

Let us close with a prayer:

Lord, in gospel times, a sinful woman discovered you at a well. In modern times, a sinful man discovered you on death row. And both the woman and the man ended up becoming missionaries in their world. Help us discover you this Lent. And through our discovery, help us become missionaries in our homes and in our own world.


Psalm 23
