El libro entero de Jonás consiste de cuatro capítulos y el capítulo que escuchamos hoy debe ser el único del cual Jonás se sentiría orgulloso. Y es que ésta es la segunda vez que el Señor le da a Jonás esta misión. En el primer capítulo Jonás responde inmediatamente al llamado de Dios . . . ¡zarpando en el primer barco que sale en dirección opuesta! Durante una tormenta brutal

los marineros lo echaron al mar, pues temían que él había despertado la ira de Dios. En el capítulo dos un pez grande se traga a Jonás, cuya desesperación lo lleva a orar. Al dársele una segunda oportunidad, en el pasaje que hoy escuchamos, obedece de inmediato; pero en el último capítulo Jonás se siente enojado. ¡Nínive era el enemigo! Y Jonás esperaba ver cumplida al menos un poco de la ira que Dios había prometido. Pero Dios le enseña que el arrepentimiento, y no el castigo, fue siempre la meta, pues la misericordia de Dios sobrepasa el enojo de Dios. Aunque Jonás haya fracasado en hacer lo correcto primero y su corazón todavía estaba dividido aun cuando hizo lo correcto, así y todo salvó de una destrucción a millares de personas, porque al fin y al cabo cumplió el llamado de Dios.

Dios nos promete una vida nueva después del arrepentimiento y la conversión. Jonás encontró esa vida nueva después de haber estado tres días y tres noches en el vientre de aquel gran pez. La gente de Nínive encontró esa vida nueva después de ayunar y ponerse ropas de penitencia. Simón, Andrés, Santiago y Juan encontraron esa vida nueva después de dejar sus redes y seguir a Jesús. Ahora nos toca a nosotros confiar en que arrepentirnos y seguir al Señor tendrá su recompensa.

Fijémonos en que Jesús no les dijo a los pares de hermanos que tenían que estudiar mucho tiempo para conocerlo, ni que tenían que pasar un examen antes de ir a pescar discípulos. The entire book of Jonah consists of only four chapters, and the chapter we hear today must be the only one Jonah would be proud of. You see, this is the second time the LORD called Jonah on this mission. In the first chapter, Jonah responds immediately to God's call . . . by jumping on the first ship sailing in the opposite direction! During a brutal storm, the sailors throw him overboard, fearing that

he brought on God's wrath. In chapter two, Jonah is swallowed by a great fish, leading him to pray in desperation. Given a second chance in the passage we hear, he obeys at once. But in the final chapter Jonah is miffed. Nineveh was the enemy! Jonah hoped that he might see at least some of God's promised wrath. But God teaches him that repentance, not punishment, was always the goal, for God's mercy trumps God's anger. Jonah may have failed to do right at first, and his heart was still divided when he did right, but he saved thousands of people from destruction because in the end he followed God's call.

God promises us new life after repentance and conversion. Jonah found it after three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish. The people of Nineveh found it after they turned to fasting and sackcloth. Simon, Andrew, James, and John found it after dropping their nets and following Jesus. Now it is our turn to trust that repenting and following the Lord will be rewarded.

Note that Jesus did not tell the pairs of brothers that they had to study him for a good long time and pass a test before they could go out and fish for more disciples. No, he told them straightaway that all they had to do was follow and he would make them fishers of others. We need not be nervous about first becoming qualified enough to reach out to others. As long as we sincerely follow him, we can invite others to follow as well.

In the Gospel with John the Baptist it tells the story of the call of the first disciples of Jesus. This passage shows how John the Baptist redirects his own disciples to become followers of Jesus. John the Baptist is standing with two of his disciples watching Jesus go by. He immediately said, "Behold the Lamb of God." This title refers to the image of the paschal lamb which was understood to be the sacrificial lamb whose death saved the Israelites and the whole world. John's two disciples then immediately followed Jesus. This was just


the beginning of a process that involves some dialogue between Jesus and the two followers.

The two followers asked Jesus where He is staying. The questions and answers that followed are on two different levels. The first level is the literal understanding. Jesus is asking them what they are seeking then the two followers ask Jesus where He is staying. The questions are basic and to the point. The second is a theological understanding which reflects the deeper reality of what discipleship really entails. On this level a disciple seeks God by following Jesus. Jesus is an itinerant preacher that moves around. Jesus does not stay in any one place. Discipleship is an invitation to stay with Jesus wherever He goes. A follower must first respond to Jesus invitation, then will see where Jesus stays.

The Apostle Andrew is identified as one of the two disciples of John the Baptist who followed Jesus. Andrew then finds his brother Peter and tells him that he has found the Messiah. Following this statement, Andrew takes Simon Peter to Jesus. Peter does not say anything during this exchange, As soon as Jesus sees Peter, Jesus states his name, Simon the son of John, and then Jesus changes the name to Cephas which is translated Peter which means rock. This call to being a disciple to Jesus is based on a faith conviction that Jesus is the Messiah. No proof that Jesus is truly the Messiah is given. It is a matter of faith.

When the disciples of John the Baptist ask where Our Lord is staying, Jesus tells them to come and see. We can ask Jesus the same question today and Jesus may respond in a number of different ways. We can ask, "Teacher where are staying?" He may say," I am sleeping under a bridge with the homeless who have no one, who have no place." Jesus may tell us, I am sitting at the same table with the poor kids no one wants anything to do with." Jesus may tell us, "I am watching TV with the elderly couple who lives alone." Jesus may say," I am holding the young woman who is terrified of the surgery she is facing." Or He might say, "I am with your children when you are note there. I am with your spouse when you are apart." He may say, "I am with you when you are feeling lost and alone." Finally Jesus may say," I am putting my shoulder to yours in bearing your crosses of illness, despair and catastrophe." "Where am I staying? Come and see." If we do, we will be true Disciples of Christ.

We are constantly called to listen for God's voice, to be attentive to the teachers God sends to us. We can then grow beyond anything we could have imagined in our relationship with God. There is no better place to grow close to God than around the banquet table of the Lord. May we receive the Body of Christ and become what we receive. We not only come and see Jesus. We receive Him into our hearts. He reveals himself in a marvelous way because He helps us realize that He really cares about us and wants to live in union with us. He wants to continue to live His life through us.---
