

La mujer de la primera lectura es considerada digna, y sin duda lo es, pues el autor declara que ella es bondadosa con su marido durante toda su vida. Ella también usa sus

talentos y sus habilidades para servir a su familia, pues procura los materiales para trabajar la lana y manejar la rueca "con sus hábiles manos" (Proverbios 31, 13). Pero eso no es todo. Ella incluso usa sus dones para ayudar a los pobres y necesitados. El escritor luego revela que la mujer teme al Señor. Ése es su secreto. Su veneración a Dios le hace servir a su esposo, a su familia y a los pobres, y por eso —como escuchamos en la última frase— es digna de ser alabada por todos. En verdad, su valor es muy superior al de las perlas, pues con su generosidad ella le ha hecho bien a multitudes.

Cuando compartimos nuestros talentos ponemos de manifiesto la presencia de Dios y proclamamos la generosidad de Dios con tanta fuerza como si lo gritáramos desde las azoteas, aunque no nos percatemos de ello. Tal vez eso sea lo que quiere indicar Jesús en su parábola: no que Dios quiere que dupliquemos nuestro dinero por invertir sabiamente, sino que compartamos nuestros dones y usemos nuestros talentos para construir el Reino de Dios, para difundir la buena nueva en todo rincón y toda rendija de nuestro mundo. Notemos las últimas palabras dirigidas a los dos servidores buenos y fieles: "Entra a tomar parte en la alegría de tu señor" (Mateo 25, 21. 23). Compartir los talentos que Dios nos ha dado nos conduce a participar de la alegría del Señor.

"No hay papeles insignificantes, sino actores insignificantes", fue una frase famosa del director ruso Konstantin Stanislavski, pues insistía en que aún los actores con papeles aparentemente insignificantes, pueden entregarse del todo a su papel. Tanto el servidor a quien le dieron sólo dos talentos como el que recibió solamente uno parecían tener sólo papeles insignificantes el día en que el amo repartió los talentos. Pero uno de ellos le sacó el máximo provecho a lo que había recibido Se le confió poco, pero ahora estaba seguro que se le iba a confiar mucho más. Ya desde ahora se le invita a compartir la alegría de su amo. Aunque ni siquiera se le dio la mitad de lo que recibió el primer servidor, así y todo probó ser un servidor bueno y fiel. También nosotros nos esforzamos porque se nos considere buenos y fieles. No importa cuán poco sea lo que se nos ha dado. estamos llamados a usarlo en servicio de algo o de alguien, más allá de nosotros mismos.

FATHER PAT



In 1988 many people were reading a pamphlet in their Evangelical and Pentecostal church. The pamphlet was titled, "Eighty-Eight: Why Christ Will Return in 1988". The congregation took this

pamphlet very seriously. They began to change their lives. They were starting to live more boldly as believers in sharing God's love with others. They were also engaging in spiritual conversations with co-workers, neighbors and family members. They became more active in their church; they were showing more traits of joy, patience and kindness. They were living the Gospel message of Jesus in a deeper way. By living as though Jesus was coming soon, they became a source of encouragement to those in their church community. They lived for something greater than their own pleasure and will.

Obviously, Jesus did not return in 1988, but those church members that are still alive continue to live courageously for Jesus. They learned that the Bible does not teach us exactly the time or date regarding the end of time. However, they live in the expectation that any day could be their last. Hopefully like those faithful church members, we too can live confidently in what God offers us in Jesus. Through His death and resurrection, Jesus provides us with hope that we can share with the world.

This type of wisdom is seen in last weeks' reading from the Book of Wisdom. This book is attributed to King Solomon. In 1Kings 3:5-14, King Solomon asked Gods' help to rule wisely over His people The book advises leaders to put God first in their lives. If they put God first they will rule wisely. On the other hand, the foolish leaders limit their focus only to this world. This book teaches us that wisdom is a gift from God that is acquired through prayer.

In the Gospel from last week, Jesus tells a story that describes 10 virgins. Five of the virgins are foolish and five are wise. The setting of the story is a wedding feast and the 10 virgins waiting to meet the bridegroom. Five virgins are foolish because they did not bring oil for their lamps, while the five wise virgins brought flasks of oil for their lamps. Allegorically, the bridegroom represents Christ, whose second coming is delayed, the oil symbolizes good works. The virgins represent the members of the Church.

The bridegroom is delayed. All the virgins become drowsy and fall asleep. The bridegroom eventually shows up at midnight. The wise virgins who brought their oil, quickly trim their lamps, but the foolish virgins have to leave to buy the oil they need. While the foolish virgins are away, the bridegroom and the virgins enter into the wedding feast and the doors are locked.

When the foolish virgins finally arrive at the wedding feast, they are locked out. They knock on the door, "Lord, Lord open the door for us'! But He says in reply, "Amen, I say to you, I do not know you." The final verse provides the moral to the story. Jesus tells us to stay awake because you do not know the day or the hour. We always have to be prepared for when Jesus will come back. We have to live each day as if it is our last.
