



Father Pat's Gospel Reflection

Have you ever seen the Special Olympics? I have not seen the Special Olympics, but I have read about it. Children and young adults who have special needs, who have physical or mental needs compete in special games just for them. It could be track and field, baseball, swimming and other sporting events. These events are inspiring, encouraging and heart- warming. The participants are so eager. These special needs athletes may not know where the finish line is, but the spectators keep cheering them on. At times they even redirect these special athletes along the way. The crowd clap and cheer the athletes on.

These Special Olympics are special. Everyone is happy. What makes these Olympics so special is that every athlete that participates receives a medal. There are no losers. Everyone is a winner. This includes those who take part in these Olympics as well as those sponsors this event.

In the same way today's readings lets us know that we are all winners in the game of life. But for this to occur we must have faith and put our trust in the Teachings of Christ. God ensures us that if we turn to Him He will not turn us away. If we turn to Him in prayer, He will always be there. He will not leave us orphans. At the same time we must accept Him as our Lord and Savior. Everyone is a winner, if we make Jesus as well as His Heavenly Father, the center of His life. In today's first reading from Genesis God wants Abraham to succeed. This is because Abraham has complete faith in God. God commands Abraham to do something that is extremely hard. He is telling Abraham that He wants him to sacrifice his son Isaac. But this is only a test that Abraham passes with flying colors. There was an unconditional trust level between God and Abraham. God promises that Abraham would have many descendants. God promises Abraham that his descendants would be as numerous as the stars in the sky and the grains of sand on the shore. Abraham believes this promise completely.

God was challenging Abraham to show his willing to put God above all else even if it meant to sacrifice his only true son Isaac. Abraham truly believes that God would be faithful to him. Abraham does not know how this will work, but that somehow everything would be fine in the end. He knows that God has the solution to this mystery. He even tells two servants that both he and Isaac would return that evening. In the longer version of this passage from Genesis, Abraham told his son that God would provide a sheep for the holocaust. Because he is faithful and loyal to God, Abraham is the father of faith for the Jewish people the Muslims and the Christians. His descendants in faith are numberless. Even though Abraham had some doubts He knew that in the end God would come through and his son would not be sacrificed.

In the gospel, the Transfiguration was like the pep talk before the big race. The pep talk was not only for Jesus. It was also for Peter, James and John, who Jesus brought with Him on Mount Tabor. On Mount Tabor the glory of Jesus was seen. Jesus becomes dazzling white. At the same time Jesus was having a conversation with both Mosses and Elijah. Elijah represented the prophecy and Moses represented the law in the bible. Together Elijah and Moses represents the fullness of God's revelation. Jesus drew strength for His upcoming passion with His conversation with these two main characters in the Old Testament.

The Transfiguration guided the apostles to help them deal with Jesus arrest and eventual death. They needed their faith to be bolster for what was going to happen on Good Friday .Jesus had just told them of his death and Resurrection. Seeing Jesus with a glorified body conversing with Moses and Elijah and hearing the voice of God speaking from a cloud telling them to listen to His Son helped them to deal with Jesus' prediction of his cross. It also gave a view of the glory of Jesus shared with Jesus' Father. This experience also gives us strength when things get tough. It also gives us confidence that Jesus will always be there for us.

God does everything for us so we can cross the finish line and get the prize of eternal life. God handed over His Son to death to save us. Like Isaac, Jesus carried the cross for execution. But, God did not allow Abraham to hurt his son Isaac. On the other hand God did not rescue His beloved Son Jesus Christ; Jesus died to save us.

If God is for us there is there is no power in heaven or earth that can separate us from His love. The only exception is our free will. It is our choice. We can either accept or reject Jesus. In other words we can refuse to run or continue in the race.

Like the athletes in the Special Olympics, we are offered every advantage to ensure our win. God gives us training through the scriptures the commandments, spiritual readings and spiritual direction. Jesus is the way to eternal life. God also gives us the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Matrimony and Holy Orders. God binds up wounds and redirects us through the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing. Our Lord gives us companions to share the journey in our faith community. Jesus nourishes us along the way in the Eucharist.. This God who is for us will feed us today with His beloved Son. With this nourishment within us, we move to the finish line together, where God is cheering us on and waiting with a crown of victory. If God is for us who can be against us?

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross devotion for Lent begins the first Friday after Ash Wednesday. This year it begins on February 16th and ends Good Friday, March 29. English is offered at 5:00 pm and Spanish is offered at 6:00 pm. On Good Friday, Live Stations of the Cross will be offered at 11:00 am and will end at approximately 2:00 pm.

Lent Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

The dual disciplines of fasting and abstinence have a long history in the Catholic Church. Going back to the early Church, the purpose behind the custom of self denial is not punishment; it is to simplify our lifestyles so that we create a certain emptiness. In this way, freed from all distractions, we are able to hear and respond to God's continued call to conversion and holiness.

- ö *Fasting* is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 to 59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- ö *Abstinence* from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence.

NOTE: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or the renewal of baptism at Easter.
