

¿Dónde guardas lo más importante para ti? Para el pueblo escogido el arca de la alianza era el objeto más importante que tenían. David determina que el arca debería de estar en un palacio y no en una tienda de campaña. Pero Dios tenía una perspectiva diferente. Para Dios

la casa de David, o sea su linaje familiar era mucho más importante que un objeto, por muy sagrado que fuese ese objeto. Por lo tanto, Dios bendijo el linaje de David, estableció una casa, pero no para el arca, sino para David. Tal vez ésa sea una lección para nosotros darle más importancia a las personas que tenemos en nuestra vida que a los bienes que tenemos. ¿Cuidamos más a nuestros seres queridos que a nuestras pertenencias?

El rey David vivía en un palacio, pero Jesús nació en un lugar que ni remotamente se asemejaba a un palacio. En vez de en un palacio lujoso en la ciudad de Jerusalén nuestro Señor nació en un insignificante y pequeño establo en Belén. De hecho, él fue concebido en el pueblito remoto de Nazaret a una distancia de varios días de Judea. ¿Por qué? María era mucho más importante que la ciudad de David. La prioridad de Dios no fue el ambiente externo de la ciudad santa, sino el vientre sagrado en que Jesús se desarrolló.

La visita de Gabriel fue impactante y bien preocupante para esta joven y humilde mujer soltera. Todo lo que le dijo Gabriel era más increíble de lo que ella jamás pudo imaginar. Sin embargo, ella inmediatamente acepta la voluntad de Dios y dice: "cúmplase en mí lo que me has dicho" (Lucas 1, 38). Es la fe y la confianza de María en el Señor lo que hace posible la encarnación. Es nuestra fe y confianza en Dios lo que continúa haciendo posible la encarnación de Jesús en el mundo de hoy.

Pregunta de la Semana

¿Cómo discierno lo que es la voluntad de Dios? ¿Estoy dispuesto a confiar en Dios y cumplir su voluntad?

DEACON JOSE

Where do you house what is most important to you? For the Chosen People, the ark of the covenant was the most important object they had. David concluded that it should be housed in a palace, not a tent. But God's

perspective was different. For God, it was the house of David, his family line, which was much more important than an object, no matter how sacred it was. Therefore, God blessed David's lineage, establishing a house, not for the ark, but for David. Perhaps that can be a lesson to us to view the people in our lives as more important than our possessions. Do we take more care of our loved ones than we do our precious belongings?

King David lived in a palace, but when it came for Jesus to be born, it did not take place in anything resembling a palace. Instead of a luxurious palace in the holy city of Jerusalem, our Lord was born in a meager stable in tiny Bethlehem. In fact, he was conceived in the remote village of Nazareth, days away from Judea. Why? The person of Mary was much more important than the City of David. God's priority was not the external environment of the holy city, but the blessed womb in which Jesus developed.

Gabriel's visit is shocking and greatly troubling to this young, lowly, unmarried woman. Everything Gabriel said was as incredible as she could possibly imagine. Yet, she immediately assents to God's will, saying, "May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). It is Mary's faith and trust in the Lord that makes the incarnation possible. It is our faith and trust in God that continues to make Jesus' incarnation possible in today's world.

Question of the Week

How do I discern what God's will is? Am I willing to trust in God and follow God's will?
