Matthew 15:21-28

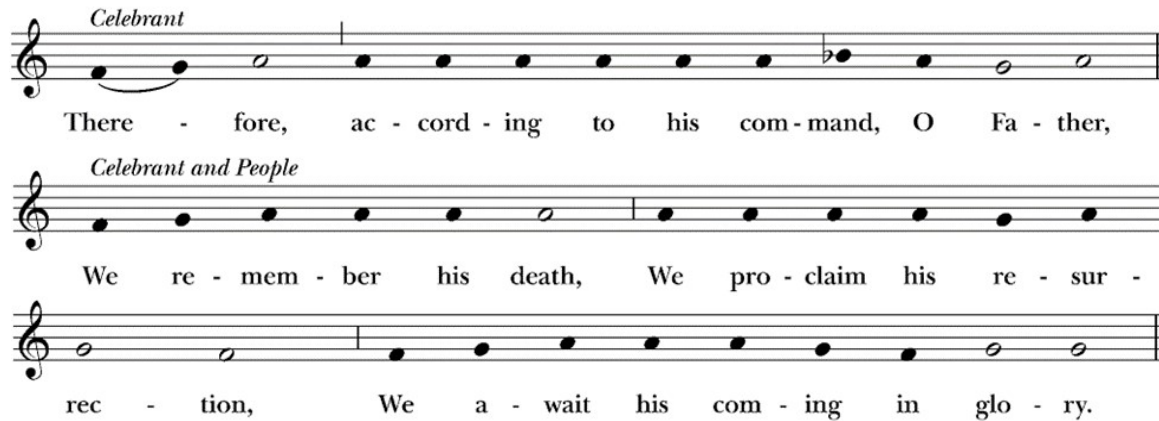

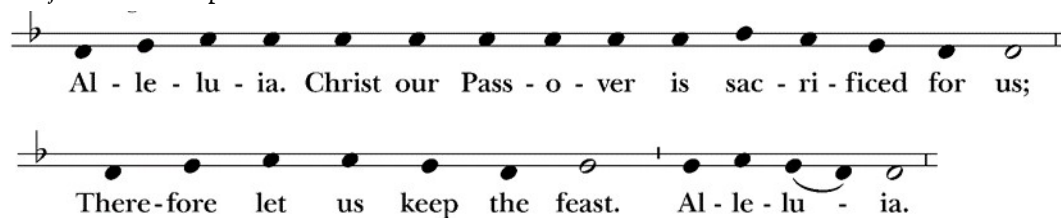
