THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The Readings for next Sunday, April 2, 2017

Ezekiel 37:12-14

Romans 8.9 11





My dear parishioners,

I can't tell you how delighted I am this weekend about our conducting the second Light of the World retreat here at St. Roch's. You've heard me say, and I am more convinced of it now than ever, that this is certainly the Lord's plan for the on-going renewal of our parish. For the retreatants and the team, for all of us, it brings into clear focus the essential teachings of our Church, but more than that, it further awakens the presence of the Holy Spirit which deepens our relationship with Jesus; making it more immediate. This is the foundation of our being a community together. Please keep this intention in your prayers.

Prayer is one of the principal ways that we are instructed to keep Lent. In the Catholic Church we have a wide variety of ways that we can pray. For instance all priests, deacons and vowed religious, from the cloistered Trappist monks at St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer down to the ordinary parish priest is mandated to use the Scriptures everyday when we pray the Breviary or what is often called the Liturgy of the Hours. Letting the inspired words of the Bible speak to us of the Lord's plans for our lives is a most worthy way of prayer. Prayer is simply defined as a conversation with God; speaking and listening.

I'd like to share with you a method of prayer that I have found to be very enriching and valuable. It is simple and effective. It's based on the foundation of our faith, our belief that our One God is a Trinity of Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

At the close of the day I spend a few minutes reviewing the events of that day in the presence of the Trinity. First with the Father, who is the Creator, the Giver of all good gifts. Is there something particularly pleasant that happened today, some blessing that happened unexpectedly; someone coming to confession after having been away for a long time, a surprising contact with an old friend? Whatever, may it lead to a prayer of Thanksgiving to the Father who provides for us.

I continue and review the day with Jesus, the One who came to redeem us from sin. In my "walk" through the day is there something that I regret; a word spoken in anger, an act of unkindness or a good deed neglected? If so I bring it to Jesus and ask for forgiveness and His blessing on anyone I have offended.

Lastly, invoking the wisdom of the Holy Spirit who is my Guide, the One who instructs and sustains me. Looking to tomorrow, I ask for guidance and the strength and stamina needed to face some challenge that I am anticipating. Confident that I will not have to go it alone.

However we pray; whether with the Scriptures, the family rosary, this daily examen, what is important is that we pull aside and spend time with the Lord. This helps us grow in holiness, in wholeness.

- 1.) I hope many of you are enjoying the daily emails from Matthew Kelly as much as I am. We are halfway through Lent. It can be "begin again, never tire of new beginnings," or "let me persevere with the plan."
- 2.) I am getting good positive feedback on my request in last week's letter about the vast library of good stuff on the internet that we can access. It's a program called FORMED. An unexpected generous gift to me will be used to sign us up. More information to come.



The LOTW & IGNITE service and prayer team is called "O2." As in O2, the silent fuel for fire. O2 serves the main retreat through prayer, service, sacrifice and silence. It is not necessary for O2 members to be a part of the retreat, however it is a great benefit. If you want to be part of an O2 team, you simply need to support the retreat behind-the-scenes in prayer and service.

**Prayer** The greatest contribution O2 makes to is their commitment to prayer.

**Praying over the Ignite team.** Before each talk, the speaker gets ready early, then heads to the Church so the O2 members can pray over them.


**Praying throughout the day.** Prayer booklets, Liturgy of the Hours, and adoration will be available each day of the retreat.

**Praying over prayer intentions.** Prayer intentions box with small slips of paper and pens, will be available for the team and retreatants to submit prayer intentions throughout the retreat weekend, O2 members can pray over the specific intentions.

**Service** Most of the logistics, setup, cleanup and behind-the-scenes work is done by O2 members. You can decide exactly what you want to do.

**Sacrifice** Part of the role is to sacrifice out of love for the retreatants.

**Silence** From the beginning of the retreat, O2 must not speak around the team and the retreatants.
