Joseph P. Schultz Council #3589 September 5th, 2019 General Meeting

Grand Knight Saul de Casas opened the meeting at 7:04 pm with seventeen members present by invoking the divine blessing of Our Father as we prayed as a Council and then reciting the pledge of allegiance.

Brother Michael Pritchard read a passage from Mathew Chapter 20, verses 1 -16. Which concluded by saying that "The last shall be first, and the first shall be last". He compared this to the love of God saying it is unfair in the sense that Gods' love is given unconditionally and equally regardless of how long the person has been practicing their faith. He also said that we should show our appreciation for the love of God through prayer.

The minutes of the July 11th meeting were amended to correct an error in the Unfinished Business section that said "**Brother Fernando** was given the responsibility of reserving the St. Claire Hall" and was corrected to say "**Brother Francisco Davalos**". The minutes were then approved with no nays.

Grand Knight Report: Grand Knight Saul De Casas began his report by congratulating the Council for receiving the Founder's Award, which was given to the Council for meeting our insurance goals. He also stated that the awards that our Council receives are not from the efforts of one but because the efforts of the entire Council.

He also mentioned that if you are interested in attending some Fourth Degree events you should try at the very least, even partially, just to support our fellow brother Knights.

The final topic he mentioned was that we emphasize the responsibilities of K of C positions so that we can enforce Consistency and participation in elected positions.

One of the letters was from the Director of the Diocese of San Diego. He thanked our Council for the donations to Seminarians Marc Gandolfo and Kyle Schanzenbach. Two other letters were from Marc Gandolfo and Kyle Schanzenbach personally thanking the Council for our support.

Another letter was from "Eudist" seminarian George G. Perez who thanked the Council for our support, especially since St. Francis is his home parish.

The final letter was from the president of Birth Choice in San Marcos thanking our Council for the donation made to them.

Chancellor's Report: No report.

Deputy Grand Knight Report:

Deputy Grand Knight Sean Colgan reported that he and a few brother Knights who volunteered went down by the "Creek" in an attempt to donate "Brian Bags", he mentioned that their efforts were successful al-

though he did have a few suggestions; Brother Sean Colgan will need more volunteers to accompany him for safety, at the very least two. Water should possibly be added to the "Brian Bag". If interested in helping with the "Brian Bag" Contact Deputy GK Sean Colgan.

Brother Michael Pritchard recommended to Brother Colgan that Father Ruben should be informed of the "Brian Bag" in case of any possible repercussions to the parish.

Service's and Program's Report:

Tootsie Roll Drive:

Brother Roger Roe began by mentioning that on Tuesday the 24th of September, a proclamation to acknowledge the "Tootsie Roll Drive" will be held at Vista City Hall at 5:30 pm.

Also the actual "Tootsie Roll Drives" would be held on the 18th, 19th, and 20th of October at the Stator Bro's on Santa Fe Avenue, and the other on Sycamore Avenue. Site Captains are still needed for the locations so if you are interested, please contact Brother Roger Roe for more information.

For those who do not know what the "Tootsie Roll Drive" is it is actually called the "Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities". It is an effort by the Knights of Columbus on a National level that has volunteers in yellow vest that say "Helping people with intellectual disabilities" collecting donations at stores around towns. In exchange for the donation the donor is offered a piece of candy, which is usually a "Tootsie Roll".

Blood Drive: No Report.

Youth Program: Brother Steven Parker mentioned to the Council that the youth groups have just gotten off of a retreat. Also that at an event where they were trying to convert people to the Catholic Faith the succeeded in recruiting 9 people.

Spanish Roundtable: No Report.

Unfinished Business:

Mora Noonan has decided that it would fit the Council and her schedule better if we had her presentation next year around March.

For the parish "Festival" the Council was asked by Juan Perez if the K of C would cover the cost of the hot dogs. Also if the K of C would host the "Beer Garden" for the "Festival" which is scheduled for October 12th. Brother Benito Juarez suggested that the topic be tabled, this was made into a motion that was supported and approved.

New Business: Brother Benito Juarez mentioned that "We are not only men of faith, we are also men of action", following this declaration he invited our Council to attend the ceremony for the "Silver Rose". Which is scheduled for September 25th, at 8:00 am at our parish and then 10:00 am at the St. Mary Star of the Sea Parish. For questions regarding the "Silver Rose" you can contact Benito Juarez.

For those who are interested, the "Silver Rose" was originally three natural, freshly cut roses that travelled from Mexico, through the United States, and into Canada and then returned back to their origin in Mexico. Although after traveling that entire path being celebrated in all three countries and coming back the roses would arrive dry and dead. To resolve this the Bishop decided to have three roses made from Silver and send those instead of the natural roses.

Fourth Degree Report: Brother Benito Juarez, the Color Guard Commander, mentioned that on Nov 2nd this year, and Feb 22nd, April and May next year there will be Fourth Degree ceremonies. Our Council is aiming to put forth our members for the Feb 22nd ceremony. Although if you would like to participate in any of the mentioned ceremonies, contact Brother Benito Juarez. Brother Jose Luis Aguilar, our Council's treasurer, gave his testimony about his recent attendance to a, "Garden of Innocence" ceremony.

Following the testimony, Brother Benito Juarez mentioned that he would like to propose an event that would commemorate the burial of over 200 children. The next 4th Degree meeting is scheduled for September 10th, In the Founders Hall, at 7:30 pm.
