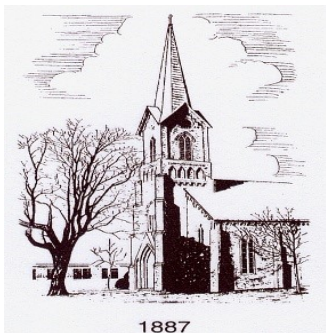

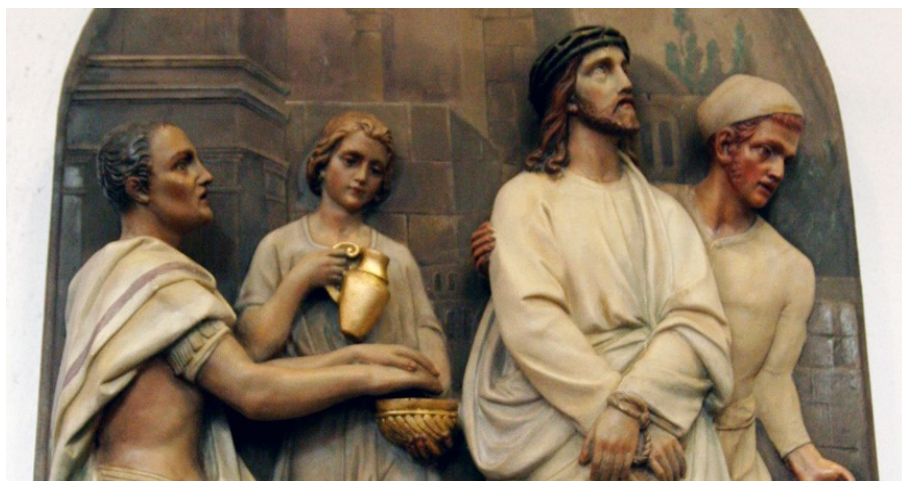

What is a Vincentian?

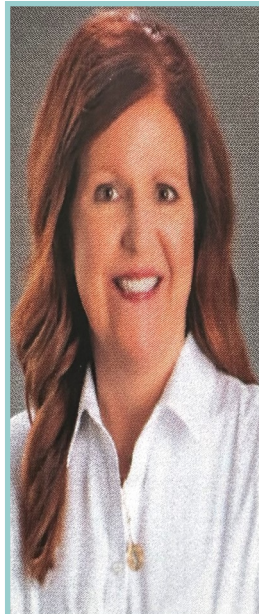

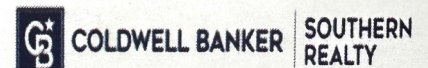
