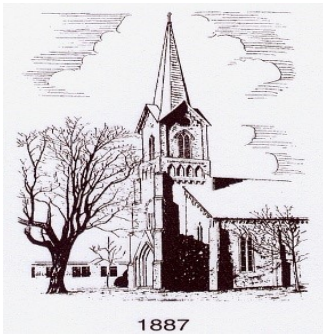

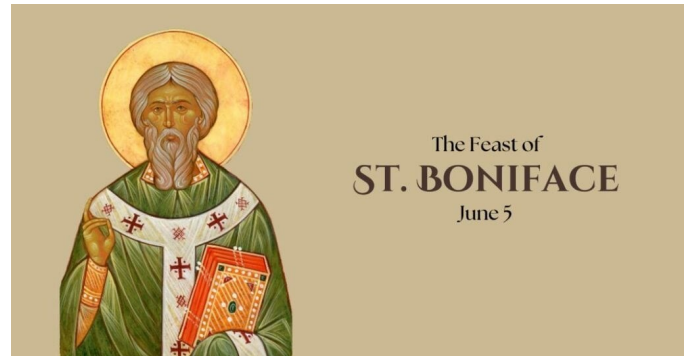

focused on St. Boniface. “At the same time, he reminds us that Christianity, by encouraging the dissemination of culture, furthers human progress. It is now up to us to be equal to such a prestigious patrimony and to make it fructify for the benefit of the generations to come.

“His ardent zeal for the Gospel never fails to impress me. At the age of 41, he left a beautiful and fruitful monastic life, the life of a monk and teacher, in order to proclaim the Gospel to the simple, to barbarians; once again, at the age of 80, he went to a region in which he foresaw his martyrdom,” he continued. “By comparing his ardent faith, this zeal for the Gospel, with our own often lukewarm and bureaucratized faith, we see what we must do and how to renew our faith, in order to give the precious pearl of the Gospel as a gift to our time.”

St. Boniface, apostle to the Germans, pray for us!

On June 5, the Church recognizes a saint in the earliest centuries of the Church. Known for his wealth of materials from *vitae*, legal documents, sermons, and correspondents, he was and is still recognized as the “Apostle to the Germans” – St. Boniface.

Born with the given name of Winfred in England, circa 675, little is known about his early life, except that he came from a respected and prosperous family. But, from an early age and against his father’s wishes, Winfred was devoted to a monastic life. He attended a monastery for schooling, became a teacher at an abbey school, and eventually was ordained to the priesthood at the age of 30.

After declining the opportunity to assume the role of abbot after the death of Abbot Wynberth of Nursling in 716, he embarked on a missionary expedition to Frisia, beginning the start of a number of papal commissions he would be sent on throughout modern-day Germany and France. He was devoted to the conversion of Germanic tribes.

After his first expedition in 717, he traveled to Rome where he was given the name Boniface by Pope Gregory II and was appointed missionary bishop for Germania. During this time, one of the most famous stories of Boniface converting many to Christianity took place in the form of “Donar’s Oak,” which was a sacred tree to Germanic pagans, who believed it to be a tree of the Roman god Jupiter. Boniface, however, decided to chop the tree down and when Jupiter did not strike him down, as the people expected, they converted to Christianity. Meanwhile, Boniface built a church from the wood of the tree and later had the first monastery in Fritzlar built as well.

Throughout his life, Boniface continued to found monasteries, establish dioceses, preside over synods, build relationships with political leaders, and fight against paganism, all the while becoming known for his Christian orthodoxy and his fidelity to the pope, according to Franciscan Media.

He was martyred by pagan Frisians on June 5, 754, while reading the Scriptures to Christian neophytes on Pentecost Sunday; a full circle moment for the beloved bishop whose life’s work of converting the Germans ended where it once began.

“Boniface’s courageous witness is an invitation to us all to welcome God’s word into our lives as an essential reference point, to love the Church passionately, to feel co-responsible for Her future, to seek her unity around the Successor of Peter,” said Pope Benedict XVI during his general audience on March 11, 2009, which was

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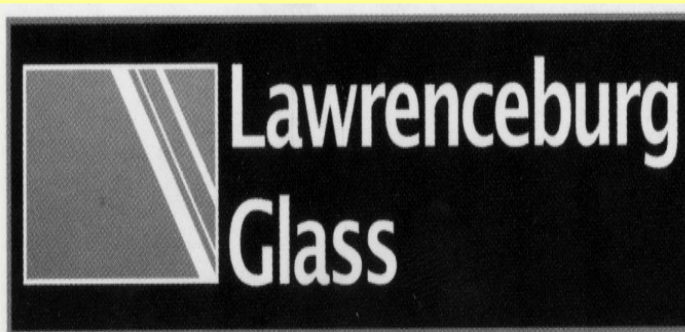
