February 16, 2020 6th Week of Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

In the tender compassion of our God, the Son of God was sent by the Father to become man and to redeem us. For thirty years, He sanctified family life in the home of his Holy Family. When the hidden life of Nazareth came to an end, Jesus began his public life.

Gradually revealing Himself through miraculous works and the attraction of his words, He taught in the city streets and the countryside. Often, He corrected misconceptions about God's love and about the Law and He revealed more explicitly what was sometimes obscure in the Old Testament. He was called "Master" because He informed the minds and hearts of the people by the wisdom of his words and actions. He taught with authority, meaning that his teaching represented the Truth, not just an educated opinion.

So, the mission of Jesus included both the instruction of the mind of man and the healing of his soul, insofar as man was redirected in how to behave toward God and neighbor. The Master both taught divine wisdom and lived out divine charity. Just as his listeners were to imitate his merciful and loving actions, so were they to conform their thinking (their minds) to his teaching.

The Mission of the Redeemer was shared with the Apostles so that after his Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension, the Mission would continue under the influence of his Holy Spirit. While He is the sole Redeemer, his disciples were commissioned, as members of his Body, the Church, to seek out the lost and to school them in Christian doctrine by their words and deeds.

Two weeks ago, we introduced the "Fishers of Men" project. Taking our inspiration from the Word of God, the title comes from our Lord's invitation to the Apostles to leave behind their fishing nets and their occupation as fishermen and to become his disciples full time.

"Come after Me and I will make you fishers of men."

Let us appreciate more fully the great privilege the Apostles shared in being called to participate in the mission that Jesus was given by the Father! That privilege is shared by every disciple of Christ in varying degrees.

Our share in the mission of Christ begins in prayer. We will be praying each week for those whom the Lord puts on our hearts using the prayers that you submit. Our parish apostles will also be visiting our neighbors — open your heart to the call of the Good Shepherd!

Thank YOU for responding to the invitation to participate in our efforts to bring souls to Christ. Their presence among us in the pews will come in time, as faith and grace convince them of the mercy of God and our love for them. I am praying for you with great affection.
