# *A word from Fr. Mark*

## **RESPONSE TO THE CORONA VIRUS**

I know this has been a difficult two weeks for each of you as it has been for parishioners throughout the diocese. In order that the Diocese of Shreveport might be a part of the solution in ending the coronavirus, Bishop Malone has asked that all parishes not celebrate Mass beginning the weekend of March 14/15 and continuing through the end of April. I am proud that we have a Bishop who has acted to protect the people of Northern Louisiana from the coronavirus. I know that not getting together with our church community and celebrating Mass together and receiving the Eucharist will be a great sacrifice. I thank you for making this sacrifice for the good of our larger community. Not being able to celebrate Mass with our community will be a sacrifice for me as well. This sacrifice will be for the good of others.

On the sign located at our church entrance you can read the message, "Let us Pray, Sacrifice and Love Others." This message is central to the meaning of Lent. It is also central to a Catholic response to the coronavirus. On Ash Wednesday I invited the parish to see Lent as a spiritual retreat, a time of entering the spiritual desert. Although you may be spending more time at home rather than at church, I ask that you continue to live out the Season of Lent. May this continue to be a Season of conversion, prayer, sacrifice and almsgiving in order to prepare for the celebration of Easter. How you live out Lent is still in your hands.

Lent is a Season of prayer. I invite you to pray at home. You can use the Little Black Books that were distributed at Church. Those who were in a Living the Eucharist group please continue to reflect on the reflections in that book. Please pray for all of those in need at this time. Pray for those who have the coronavirus, for families who have lost loved ones at this time and for nations that are experiencing sickness and death. Yes, we are called to live out solidarity, which means that people of all nations are our brothers and sisters. So, let us pray for those areas of the world that have the highest numbers of citizens who have contracted and have died from the coronavirus. Please pray for an end to the virus and the discovery of a vaccine. I ask that you pray for government and religious leaders who are making difficult decisions at this time. I ask that you especially keep Bishop Malone in your prayers.

Lent is a time of fasting and sacrifice. On Ash Wednesday I spoke about the importance of making sacrifices which would truly bring you closer to Christ. You are now being asked to make an involuntary and surprising sacrifice, the sacrifice of celebrating the Mass and receiving the Eucharist. May all sacrifices that you make during this Lent, including not celebrating the Mass, bring about conversion in your life. May it bring you closer to those who are not able to celebrate Mass every day as we are. May we pray that the Risen Lord come ever closer to us in this time. When this sacrifice is over may we have a greater sense of the great gift that is the true presence of the Eucharist.

Lent is a Season of loving others or almsgiving. I pray that for you this Lent will be a time of increased tolerance and love of others. We experience people around us becoming overwhelmed with fear and panic. May this be a time of trusting in the Lord. May we communicate our trust in the Lord to others. Beyond this may we find ways to reach out to those who are sick or in need. Over the weekend of March 20/21 our parish would have taken up the Lenten second collection for Catholic Relief Services (CRS). You can bring a check to the office which will be sent to CRS. The parish has distributed Operation Rice Bowls. The money raised from the Operation Rice Bowls will also go to CRS. Please turn in the Operation Rice Bowls at the end of Lent for this important charity. CRS will assist vulnerable people throughout the world, including in countries affected by the coronavirus.

It is essential for parishioners to continue to tithe during this challenging time. I will continue to look for ways to minister to parishioners. The parish relies on tithing in order to meet its commitments.

Fr. Seby and I as well as the deacons will continue to reach out to those who need spiritual assistance and the reception of the Sacraments. Please call the church office at 798-1887 in order to receive this assistance.

Fr. Seby and I will hear confessions at 3 pm on Saturdays and at 11 am on Sundays and by appointment.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church will be open from 11 am on Sunday until 5:30 pm for prayer before Christ in the tabernacle.

The Church office will communicate any changes concerning scheduling of events or Masses.




## Parish Lenten Project: Operation Rice Bowl

## **SAINT OF THE MONTH** **CRISTOBAL MAGALLANES** **FEAST DAY- MAY 21**

Saint and Martyr Cristobal Magallanes was born June 30, 1869 in Guadalajara, Mexico to a farming family. As a youth he worked as a shepherd, but felt called to look after human "sheep", and entered the seminary at the age of 19.

He was ordained in Guadalajara in 189 and served as chaplain at the School of Arts and Works of the Holy Spirit in Guadalajara. He was then designated as Parish priest in his home village where he served for two decades. There he also opened a carpentry business to provide jobs for local men and helped/plan and construct a dam to aid the people of the area.

During this time in Mexico's history, the government tried to eliminate the practice of faith and the seminary that Cristobal had attended was closed. So, in 1915 Father Cristobal opened his own small seminary and soon had more than a dozen students. The government accused the priest of trying to incite rebellion, even though Cristobal preached against violence of any kind. He was on his way to celebrate

Mass when arrested, and without trial he and 21 other priests and three lay Catholics were executed on May 21, 1927. He was age 57.

Cristobal Magallanes is venerated in Roman Catholicism. Pope John Paul II beatified him on November 2 1992, and canonized him on May 21, 2000.
