Dear Friends,

PARISH HISTORY

A rich history of serving area Catholics...

St. Paul Parish of Highland, IL is but a few years younger than Highland itself. In December 1843, the Catholics in and around Highland (a village of 60 families) decided to build a frame church. The cornerstone was laid on May 1, 1844 and was ready for occupancy in 1846. In 1854, a new brick church was built and on Easter Sunday, 1856, the first services were held. In 1951, the second church was razed to make room for a much needed larger church with a seating capacity of 800. On October, 12, 1952, the dedication of the present church was held. Through the years, St. Paul's has grown to meet the needs of its congregation. Today, the parish serves more than 5,000 area Catholics.

St. Paul School provides Catholic education of children from pre-school through eighth grade. The current grade school was constructed in 1956, with a major renovation in 1993.

In 1995, the former St. Paul High School building was renovated to better serve St. Paul Parish. It is now known as the parish center, St. Paul Hall. The building is now used for the Religious Education Program, meetings, parish gatherings, gymnasium, and cafeteria.





IMPORTANCE OF REGISTRATION

In order to assure full membership in the St. Paul faith community and guarantee that you will receive regular communication from your parish, please register with us as soon as possible. In addition, your parish membership is necessary before you can prepare to receive the initiation sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation or the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. Register at the parish office or by calling 618-654-2339.

GENERAL INFORMATION

St. Paul Parish publishes a weekly bulletin with detailed information about parish ministries and activities. Please read the bulletin and become actively involved in our parish. The parish also maintains a website **www.stpaulhighland.org**, where you can find additional parish and school information, on-line giving opportunities, and more. Please visit the site regularly. GENERAL POLICIES

- 1. All buildings on St. Paul Parish and School property are smoke-free and smoking in any building is not permitted.
- All parish buildings and property are off limits for non-parish fundraising activities. Only St. Paul Parish groups, functions and organizations are permitted to fundraise, but only by making a request through the parish office.
- 3. Parish facilities are available for parish use only.
- 4. Any parishioner wishing to schedule use of facilities at St. Paul Parish must: make a request through the parish office, be responsible for signing out and returning the required key, and take full responsibility for the facilities used
- 5. The use of skateboards, roller blades, roller skates, bicycles, scooters, etc. on parish property is not permitted due to insurance regulations.
- 6. In case of severe weather, all events and meetings are cancelled if there are Highland School District closings. For weekend Masses and events, use your good judgement about whether it is safe to travel to the parish.

CEMETERY INFORMATION

St. Paul owns and operates St. Joseph Cemetery located on Michael Road in Highland. The management and operation of the cemetery is governed through a joint venture between parish staff and a cemetery board, comprised of parishioners. Maintenance and landscaping for the cemetery is also performed by the parish. ST. PAUL PARISH CHURCH ETIQUETTE

Our church is a sacred place for divine worship where the Son of God, Jesus is present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, in the tabernacle. Even further, Jesus is present in each of us and all our brothers and sisters around us, and we need to treat each other with due respect. As we enter God's house, we need to remember that there is something profound and ageless going on...God is changing the world! And, we get to participate!

To that end, here are a few reminders...

- ♦ The Church asks us to fast one hour prior to receiving the Eucharist where we do not eat or drink anything but water and medicine. (Come hungry, leave happy!)
- ♦ Please do not chew gum during Mass. (Refresh your life with Jesus FIRST; then double your pleasure, double your fun after Mass.)
- Engage in the Mass as it is a celebration of the entire community; private prayer and devotions, such as the rosary, should be prayed before or after Mass. (Play nice!)
- Bring children's Bibles or age appropriate Bible story books and soft, quiet toys for toddlers. (Adults can play with toys after Mass.)
- Put your mobile devices aside; leave them in your vehicle or home. If you have them with you, move them to the silent mode. No texting, working, or playing games, etc. (Can you hear me now?)
- Bow to the Altar before entering your pew; genuflect to the tabernacle. (Kiss the pastor!)
- ◆ Take a bathroom break immediately before you leave home or use the bathroom before entering the church proper. (Raise your hand during Mass for permission to go potty.)
- ♦ If you need to exit the church proper during Mass, wait for the Hospitality minister's cue to return to your pew. Avoid creating these distractions during the readings, homily or Eucharistic prayer. (Distractions will result in your being sent to the pastor's office.)
- Move the kneelers to the upright position slowly and quietly. (Make noise on your steering wheel or dash on the way home.)
- ♦ Do not carry on conversation during Mass. (We want to hear the scoop too!)
- Parents with crying children may go to the "cry" room. (Or parents who want to cry.)
- Refrain from leaving Mass early. (Shock devices have been installed on all outside doors.)
- Wear proper attire during Mass so as to dignify our celebration as special. Dress modestly and appropriate for Mass. (Tux and evening gown optional.)
- ♦ Move to the middle of the pew to allow for seating of others. (There is an extra charge for the end of pews.)
- Participate through responses and singing. (God made your voice, the least you can
 do is punish Him with it!)
- Children are encouraged to attend Mass and participate in Fr. Pat's children's homily. (Sneaky way to get the parents to pay attention.)

CELEBRATING SACRAMENTS AT ST. PAUL PARISH

The sacraments are Christ's own gift that provide us with His grace which enables each of us to turn back to God and to remain united with God through this life and through eternity. They are the divine helps which God gives us to enable us to; believe the truths of His faith, live according to His moral code, and grow in His gift of divine life, thereby strengthening and building up the Church. The seven sacraments are a fundamental part of the Catholic faith.

Sacraments of Initiation

God's grace, by its nature, is invisible. However, God in His wisdom, chose to bestow His grace in a visible way to give us the quieting certainty that we had received grace when He did give it. The visible carriers of grace in the three sacraments of initiation are: water for the grace that cleanses in baptism, the appearances of bread and wine for the grace which nourishes and gives growth in the Most Holy Eucharist, and oil for the grace which strengthens in confirmation. The sacraments of baptism, confirmation and the Most Holy Eucharist are so interrelated that they are required for full Christian initiation.

Baptism

This is the beginning of the sacramental life of an individual within, or entrance into, the Church. When a person is baptized, they are cleansed of original sin and receive sanctifying grace, the life of God within their soul. This grace prepares them for the reception of the other sacraments. The guidelines for infant baptism at St. Paul Parish are:

- ◆ The parent(s) of the child MUST:
 - ♦ Be registered member(s) of St. Paul Parish
 - Be actively participating and living their faith (minimally following the Precepts of the Church) for at least six months; attending Mass regularly—daily or weekly to ensure that they truly intend to raise this child in the practice of the faith
 - Attend and participate in one Pre Jordan class offered each month in the parish. This is a required preparation before a child may be baptized at St. Paul. Attendance is required for <u>each child</u> to be baptized.
- ♦ Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, usually the first two full weekends of the month, at alternate Mass times.

The Most Holy Eucharist

The sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist is the most glorious sacrament, in which Christ the Lord himself is contained, offered and received, and by which the Church constantly lives and grows. The Eucharistic Sacrifice, the memorial of the death and resurrection of the Lord, in which the sacrifice of the cross is preserved over the centuries, is the summit and the source of all Christian worship and life. It signifies and effects the unity of the people of God and achieves the building up of the Body of Christ...(Can. 897)

It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents, as well as of the pastor, to see that children who have reached the age of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession...(Can. 914)

To meet that goal, second grade students and their families will continue their child's faith journey through sacramental preparation for **First Reconciliation** and **First Holy Eucharist.** St. Paul School students complete their preparation and formation during Religion classes in school and public school students complete the process through PSR classes. First Reconciliation is <u>typically</u> celebrated in December with First Holy Eucharist following in April.

Confirmation

The sacrament of confirmation impresses a character, and by it the baptized, continuing on the path of Christian initiation, are enriched by the gift of the Holy Spirit and bound more perfectly to the Church. The sacrament strengthens them and obliges them more firmly to be witnesses to Christ by word and deed and to spread and defend the faith. (Can. 879) This is the final of the three sacraments of initiation.

At St. Paul Parish, the sacrament of confirmation is celebrated in the eighth grade for both Catholic and public school youth. St. Paul students complete their preparation and formation during Religion classes during school and the public school students complete the process through an evening program. In addition, all parish 8th grade candidates participate in a number of discipleship opportunities throughout the year. The date for the sacrament of confirmation to be celebrated in our parish is usually in April with +Bishop Thomas John Paprocki.

Marriage

Within the Catholic Church, marriage is a holy vocation; a call from God to grow in love and holiness; a call to be faithful. Responding to this call is a big responsibility requiring the couple's personal faith response in the context of our parish community. The Church provides support to engaged couples through a special marriage preparation process.

One or both of the engaged must be registered and living their faith at St. Paul Parish for at least six (6) months in order to celebrate their wedding here. Non parishioners may be married at St. Paul as long as they are registered and living their faith at the Catholic parish where they currently reside.

Engaged couples must contact the parish priest at least six (6) months, preferably a year, in advance of the proposed date of their wedding.

Couples can pick up a marriage preparation packet at the parish office as soon as they are engaged. Wedding dates will be booked permanently on the parish calendar after the initial interview with the parish priest.

Couples: Please secure your wedding date at the church BEFORE making arrangements for the reception hall, caterers, etc.

The preparation process includes:

- ♦ The initial interview with the priest/deacon
- ♦ An online pre-marriage inventory completed
- A review of the pre-marriage inventory with the priest/deacon
- A formal marriage preparation program
- ♦ The planning of the wedding liturgy—contact Dineen Czar at dczar@stpaulhighland.org
- Rehearsal & Wedding Ceremony

REGULARIZING MARRIAGES IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

It is always our hope that Catholics follow Catholic "form" when getting married. This is one of the Precepts of the Catholic Church. Destination weddings and other weddings outside the church building are not permissible for Catholic persons. Marriage within the church building itself maintains an individual's good standing in the Church.

Even now, if your wedding didn't follow the Church's form, you are encouraged to attend Mass regularly. However, the Church understands that you need to convalidate (regularize) your marriage before receiving the Eucharist.

Couples who are in this situation are asked to speak with the pastor, deacon, or another member of our parish staff to inquire about having your marriage recognized in the Catholic Church. We are filled with hope for your returning to us at the table of the Eucharist.

The Anointing of the Sick

"By the sacred anointing of the sick and the prayer of the priests, the whole Church commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, that he may raise them up and save them. And indeed she exhorts them to contribute to the good of the People of God by freely uniting themselves to the Passion and death of Christ." (CCC 1499)

"The Anointing of the Sick 'is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death.' Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived." (CCC 1514)

"If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced." (CCC 1515)

"...It is the duty of pastors to instruct the faithful on the benefits of this sacrament. The faithful should encourage the sick to call for a priest to receive this sacrament. The sick should prepare themselves to receive it with good dispositions, assisted by their pastor and the whole ecclesial community, which is invited to surround the sick in a special way through their prayers and fraternal attention." (CCC 1516)

Parishioners who are seriously or critically ill, or having surgery, should (or their family member) contact the parish office, 654-2339 OR Fr. Pat, 618-830-1595, for the celebration of the sacrament.

Holy Orders and the Vowed Life

How is God calling you to live out your life in service to Him and His people? Some people live the single life as a witness to the holiness of God in the world. For many, God's call to them is to the sacred bond of marriage. For others though, there is a "different" call. God is still calling holy men and women to serve Him and the Church through sacred orders (bishops, priests and deacons) and the religious life. Could God possibly be calling you to something "different"? Consider the priesthood or religious life as the way that God might be calling you to follow Him!

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN WORKSHOP

The Diocese of Springfield mandated that each parish make available and/or offer the "Protecting God's Children" session to ALL parishioners to create and promote a safe environment for everyone. The policy of our diocese now REQUIRES that ALL persons (Catholic and Non Catholic) who seek to serve or volunteer in the church in any capacity MUST attend the "Protecting God's Children" seminar and also have a background check taken by our diocese.

Sessions are typically held the first Thursday of every month (except December), and last 2 1/2 to 3 hours (watch bulletin for details on upcoming sessions). Each participant will complete a background check at the session. Background checks must be renewed every 5 years.


