FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

February 10, 2019

For a humble guy, St. Paul really tells it like it is. It seems some of the Corinthians did not believe that Christ rose from the dead, or that resurrection was a spiritual symbol of forgiveness of sins. So Paul lists those witnesses who actually saw the risen Jesus, last and least of these being Paul himself. Now we are used to thinking of Paul as one of the greatest apostles, even though we know he once persecuted Christians. So you might think he is being overly humble, like someone fishing for a compliment. No, Paul is only interested in making sure the Corinthians understand just how much God has done.

Besides being "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), that is, coming to follow Christ in such an unusual way, he felt unworthy because of so many Christians he hurt before his conversion. Yet he turns that unworthiness into an example of how much God has done through him, so he can say that he worked harder than any other apostles because of God's grace, not Paul's strength. The same grace that turned a former enemy into a friend also gave him the strength to spread the Gospel farther than anyone else at that time.

In today's Gospel, Peter has a similar experience. He was a fisherman who knew his business and knew that some days, the fish just aren't there. So when Jesus tells him to go out one more time, try one more cast of the nets, Peter probably thought he'd show Jesus that it was no use. Then when they caught enough fish to fill both boats, he realized that his pride was sinful. He was unworthy to receive such bounty from the Lord. And yet Jesus tells him that "you will be catching men" (Luke 5:10).

How many of us are like Peter and Paul, thinking we know just what our place in the world is, relying on our own strengths to do our jobs? Surely that's all God expects of us, right? They found Jesus calling them to a much more challenging life. Do we have the courage to listen to God's call to serve?

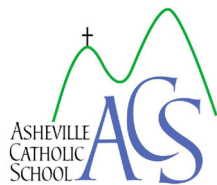

“Walking Our Spiritual Paths: An Introduction to the Spirituality of the Cherokee People” March 19-24, 2019 in Cherokee, NC with Cherokee presenters. Topics include Cherokee history, religious beliefs, cultural expressions and Historical Grief and Intergenerational Trauma, which outlines how Native Americans lost their sense of identity through govern-

ment policies of forced assimilation into the dominant culture. We visit Kituwah, the Mother Town of the Cherokee People, and observe how the Cherokee language is being taught to the next generation. Each day the group will participate in Theological Reflection with Fr. John Rausch to integrate the experience with our faith life. Cost is \$400 which includes lodging, all activities and some meals; a private room is \$600. Cost for commuters is \$200. Limited partial scholarships are available. Also, you may be unaware that hospitals, by law, will not automatically inform us of your presence there - even if you state your religious affiliation as Catholic on an entrance form. Whether you are hospitalized, recuperating, or simply unable to attend parish services, you or your family member is required to inform us as to your desire for visitation and/or reception of Communion.
