**SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME  
 February 24, 2019**

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new commandments, telling us how to live and act in the world as His disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of His later speech about loving one another as He loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as He did, as God does.

**RADICAL LOVE**

Have you ever read or heard anything about Jesus being called a radical? What such a statement ignores is that God has been a radical all through salvation history. What kind of superior being forgives the kind of unloving actions humankind has committed through the centuries? Answer: a God of radical mercy, kindness, love. In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches that, like Himself, like God, we must love with God-like radical compassion, even those who are our enemies. Didn't Jesus give us an extreme example, forgiving those who put Him to death? How difficult it is to be like God, like Jesus, forgiving, even loving, the very people who have treated us badly!

The first reading gives another example. David was under a death sentence by King Saul, who had become David's enemy through jealousy. Given an opportunity to murder Saul in his sleep, David chose to let him live, out of respect for God's will toward Saul. David recognized that the only way for him to do God's will was to love Saul, his enemy, enough to refrain from being judge, jury, and executioner.

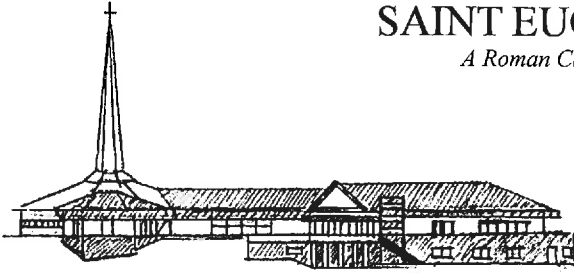

Dear Bishop Peter Jugis,

On October 22, 2018, the Parish Council of St. Eugene Catholic Church respectfully requested a response to the recent reports of sexual abuse. We were and remain deeply concerned about the impact of abuse in our parish and across the country. We asked you for transparency, clarity and communication regarding priests who committed sexual abuse in our diocese, and we asked you to lead us through this difficult and divisive time.

We are disappointed that we have received almost no communication from your office in response. We were told someone would be in contact, but we have heard nothing. Our Child and Youth Protection Committee members made repeated contacts to your office, speaking with your executive assistant, and the general counsel for the parish. In each case, we have been told "someone would get back to us". But no one has.

When the Charlotte News & Observer reported on January 11, 2019, that the Diocese of Charlotte would not release the names of priests accused of sexual abuse as other dioceses have, we realized that your failure to respond to us leaves us with the impression that it was an intentional snub.

We urge you to follow the examples of other dioceses, which have (in addition to releasing names of sexual abusers) improved resources for victims reporting abuse. In the report, your spokesperson is quoted as saying there's a concern that publishing a list of predatory priests might further hurt victims. Respectfully, we disagree. Transparency protects victims by ensuring predatory priests aren't protected by silence. Transparency allows for healing. This crisis exists because in too many instances, those entrusted with our spiritual welfare in the Catholic Church have engaged in a practice of repression, silence and fear.

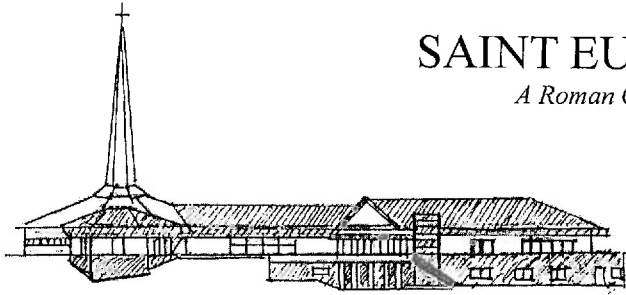
Our diocese's reporting mechanism for victims of abuse ("hotline") is abysmal. We have repeatedly tried to call through the number for reporting abuse. We have left messages that went unanswered for more than two weeks. We've received almost no response. Victims who are abused under the Church's watch deserve better than this.

While we remain prayerful that you will take action, we are not going to sit back silently. We will continue to take appropriate action while we follow up with you. Our parish members deserve to know that our Diocese is fully committed to ensuring a safe environment.

Again, we are asking for your visible spiritual leadership on this issue. Our parish is very concerned about how the handling of sexual abuse in our Church affects all of us as the Body of Christ. We know that our duty as Christians is to speak up against abuse and to protect our children and youth. Once again, we ask that your office meet with us to discuss these issues and determine the next steps that we can jointly take to move forward. We're praying for our Church.

RE: Child and Youth Protection Committee

Back in September we had a listening and sharing session about the sexual abuse crisis ravaging our Church. As a subcommittee flowing from Parish Council, I then commissioned three parishioners who passionately shared a profound desire to help reform a broken system. This "Child and Youth Protection Committee" began their work of prayer, study and listening. These laypeople have as their foundation a love for the Lord and the Catholic Church. Their focus was to be a part of healing the brokenness that so many are feeling in our parish and promote best practices in how to make that happen as it relates to the abuse crisis. Parish Council then drafted and sent a letter in October to the Bishop with a call for transparency and reform. The response at the Diocesan level was underwhelming, clumsy and disjointed (as we reported last week). We encountered and identified some frustrating inefficiencies in how this topic is handled in the Diocese of Charlotte. Today Bishop Jugis received our parish's second letter that you will see in this weekend's bulletin.

The bishop responded immediately. I received a phone call right away from the Victim Assistance Coordinator at the Diocese (Mr. David Harold) asking me how he can help. He wanted a detailed explanation about the issues we encountered with the "hotline" for making a claim and reporting abuse when we tested the system. David was clear that he was responding to us at the command of Bishop Jugis with the job to address any problems we experienced on how to effectively make a report. I am happy to share that we are being heard and seeing concrete results. Because of our parish's perseverance on this issue, this diocesan wide hotline will now ensure that the Victim Assistance Coordinator receives a claim directly and will respond within 48 hours. I am humbled, edified, and most grateful for the Christ-centered approach the people of God in our parish have had in this important call for reform and change. Please join me in praying for healing and a restoration of trust in the Church. May God give us all the grace to continue being a part of the reform for a safer and healthier Church!
