THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today is Gaudete Sunday, which means "rejoice." For three weeks now we have been preparing for Christmas and, one hopes, enjoying some peace to pray and anticipate the coming of the Lord, not just as a baby two thousand years ago, but also in the end-times, the parousia, when the Lord will come again in glory.

This is the Sunday when the rejoicing begins. Advent, unlike Lent, is not a penitential time, but a time of waiting and anticipation for the fulfillment of God's promises. "[We] will see the glory of the Lord, /the splendor of our God" (Isaiah 35:2).



A TRADITION ROOTED IN CHRIST

amilies of Polish, Slovak and Lithuanian background observe this Christmas Eve Tradition. Family members and guests each are handed an Oplatek and they each break off a piece from one another and eat it, expressing best wishes and blessings to each other, and asking for forgiveness.

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. The eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year such as good health, success or happiness. The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together express ones unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

In honor of animals that were present at Christ's birth, family pets can also partake in this meal. The wafers are generally white in color, there are colored (pink) Oplatki made especially for pets (both colors are edible for people). This is also a great representation of the important role that pets play in our family today.

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.



The Celebration of Las Posadas

Las Posadas is a traditional nine-day Mexican celebration from December 16th to 24th, commemorating Mary and Joseph's journey through Bethlehem in search of shelter for the birth of Jesus. Families reenact this pilgrimage, going from house to house singing and asking for lodging, often ending the evening with food, songs, and fellowship.

Originating in 18th-century Mexico as a way for the faithful to continue celebrating the Masses of Aguinaldo, Las Posadas has become a cherished tradition among Latin American communities in the United States. Beyond its festive customs, it reminds us of the struggles of the Holy Family—and echoes the daily journeys of many families seeking safety and hope today.

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hot-line (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis.this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being.

Information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.

The beautiful icon on the cover...

This Byzantine-inspired icon shows the Virgin Mary with her hands raised in prayer, bearing the Christ-Child on her chest. Known as the "Weeping" icon of Novgorod, it is celebrated for a 12th-century miracle, when the icon's tears were seen as a sign of divine protection during a siege. On this Third Sunday of Advent — Gaudete Sunday, a day of rejoicing — the icon invites us to reflect on the joy and hope brought by Christ's coming. Mary, as intercessor and bearer of Emmanuel, points us toward the light of salvation and reminds us that even in times of fear or uncertainty, God's presence brings comfort and deliverance.


