
SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Our readings today together provide powerful insight into how to be faithful disciples. Sirach reminds us that, in the deepest places in ourselves, in our primary attitudes and tendencies in living, we face choices. We have real agency to embrace what is good, and resist what is destructive, for our own flourishing and for the common good. We are shaped, but we are not ultimately shackled, by social forces or by other persons. In Matthew's Gospel, we read that God cares not only about our observing boundaries, but about these deep areas of ourselves and our basic choices in life. God knows our fears and wounds that influence our choices. God is actively providing wisdom, as Paul wrote to the Corinthians. God will help us sort out the bewildering decisions we often face. God is here, deep within, offering challenge, healing, and courage so we may choose to love.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's still months away, but parish ministers—especially those involved in the catechumenate—already look toward Lent and the Easter Triduum. Until fairly recent times, the days before Easter were shaped by an awareness of the Passion, yet the faithful were largely left on their own in engaging these mysteries. A thousand years ago, the Easter Vigil as the Church's central initiation liturgy had disappeared. By the early 1950s it was a minor Holy Saturday morning ritual, attended mostly by clergy and a few invited guests, and seen chiefly as the blessing of the paschal candle and Easter water.

Today, Holy Saturday is recognized as part of the paschal fast, not a day for early Easter celebration. The diminished liturgies of the Triduum were largely an accident of history, rooted in the loss of Lent as a period of final formation for catechumens. Beginning around 1880, scholars gradually recovered the earlier tradition, first in a few European monasteries, restoring elements that would eventually renew the Church's celebration of Easter. ~James Field

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hot-line (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. This end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being.


Living Stewardship Now



