

Church Building History

Holy Family has taken many steps to get where we are today. It's been a 39-year journey, during which we've grown by leaps and bounds, often exceeding expectations. Holy Family was "Canonically established" on January 30, 1980.

Initially, Holy Family was planned as a small parish. It was one of several smaller parishes to be formed from larger ones, as it had been from St. Charles Parish. Without an official building in which to worship, Holy Family met at New Mark Middle School and in family's homes for Mass and the various ministries.

Father Pat Rush was named pastor for the newly established parish. Not only would he pastor a new parish—he was a new pastor out of seminary school. When it came time for parishioners to select a name, two paths led to "Holy Family." Mostly young families attended the new parish and the National Conference of Catholic Bishops designated 1980 as "The Year of the Family."

When the church was completed in 1982, the parish had 402 families. It consisted of the worship space, the "Family Room" and an office suite in a small basement. Just as the new parish was getting started, Father Pat was transferred. Father Lloyd Opoka started as the second pastor on Sunday, October 30, 1983.

In 1987, the parish built the rectory to the east of the church. On July 4, 1993, Father Robert H. Stewart came as pastor. Holy family had expanded to 654 families and discussion for expansions had begun. When the plan was revised in 1997, it included a 1,200-seat capacity church, but it was scaled back to an education wing and parish hall due to cost. The addition included ten classrooms, a parish hall and kitchen, nursery, offices and parlor.

By 2000, the parish had 845 households. It had been projected to have only 600 by then, but the Northland grew more quickly than anticipated during a housing boom. Parish leadership knew Holy Family would need to take steps in a different direction. The parish began searching for a larger parcel of land because growth would outstrip projections.

The parish purchased 60 acres at 106th and N. Woodland Avenue for \$780,648 in 2003. In 2004 the facilities committee procured a new master plan and site program for the new location. Father Matthew Brumleve celebrated his first mass at Holy Family on November 27, 2004, as Holy Family's fourth pastor.

The worship space continued getting more crowded, so in 2005, glass was removed from the partition between the worship space and the Family Room. By that time, the parish had over 900 families.

In the fall of 2012, parishioners were presented with four options of expansion: three included building on the new property off $106^{\rm th}$ and Woodland and the final option to sell all or part of the land and expand on the existing property. Surprisingly, option four (to stay put) was the popular vote.

In January, 2014, Father Philip Egan became the fifth pastor at Holy Family. In September 2016, Holy Family sold the land purchased on 106th and Woodland for \$1,130,000. While the parish decided building on this land was not in our best interest, the purchase itself proved to be a good decision producing a \$349,352 profit. This money was rolled into the next capital campaign to expand our church and classroom/parish hall.

The Together We Grow capital campaign kicked off in the fall of 2017 and ran through 2020. The church expansion included increased seating to 800, installing pews and a baptismal font in the church, resorting the "Family Room" as you enter the building, restoring and mounting acquired organ pipes, creating a devotional area and updating the heating and cool systems.

The classroom and parish hall expansion plans included increasing the amount of classrooms to 14, creating a dedicated youth space, add two new offices, expand the parish hall for an additional 112 seats, add storage and build three new bathrooms, including a "family" bathroom.

The Mass of Dedication took place on August 3, 2019 with Bishop James V. Johnston presiding, along with Fr. Egan, Fr. Brumleve, Fr. Opoka and Fr. Rush.

On June 30, 2023, Father Philip Egan retired from the priesthood and as pastor of Holy Family Catholic Church. July 1, 2023, Father Steve Rogers became the sixth pastor of our family of 1,145 households that we call holy!

PARISH HALL GUIDELINES

The following may use the Holy Family parish hall at no cost, but donations to defray utility expenses are requested of non-parish organizations:

- Recognized parish organizations/events
- Diocesan groups with pastor's approval
- Local neighborhood associations with pastor's approval
- City and county government agencies for public meetings

The hall is available for rent by registered, active, tithing parishioners for private family celebrations, such as wedding receptions, anniversary parties, birthday celebrations, showers, etc., with the pastor's approval at a fee.

The parish hall is *not* available for:

- Political rallies or candidates
- Rental by non-parishioners
- Commercial purposes

Reservations: Contact Marie Relic, business manager, at 816-436-9200, ext. 302, for availability. Parish events receive priority scheduling. The facility will only be made available for rental functions after parish needs are met and the annual parish calendar is complete. The facility will not be reserved until the facility use agreement is completed and returned along with the damage deposit. Facility use agreements will not be made more than one year prior to the event.

For licensees, a refundable deposit of \$300 will be required upon return of the completed facility use agreement. The deposit may be refunded in whole or in part, depending on condition of the hall after use, as assessed by the maintenance supervisor and approved by the business manager and pastor.

Rental Fees: \$125 plus \$125 liability insurance 1-25 people \$250 plus \$125 liability insurance 26-50 people

\$500 plus \$125 liability insurance \$500 plus \$125 liability insurance \$975 plus \$125 liability insurance \$1250 plus \$125 liability insurance \$1250 plus \$125 liability insurance

The parish will charge an additional fee for clean-up of the facility. This fee will be based on the size of the event and will be agreed upon at the time the event is scheduled. The rental and clean-up fees are due and payable two weeks prior to the scheduled event.

Insurance Coverage: Tenant User Liability Insurance Program (TULIP) provides insurance coverage that is underwritten by K&K Insurance and is handled through the diocesan broker at Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services for a fee of \$125 per event.

PARISH HALL GUIDELINES CONT'D

Accommodations: Church agrees to provide the Parish Hall in clean condition and provide tables and chairs. Occupancy for the Parish Hall is 550 (chairs only) or 275 (round tables & chairs). Groups larger than 550 cannot be accommodated. Tables and chairs will be set up for Licensee's event, provided the Maintenance Supervisor is notified of the configuration two weeks prior to the event.

Church does not provide kitchen utensils, tableware, table covers, dishcloths, towels or dishwashing detergent. The parish allows use of the coolers, ice machine, refrigerator, freezer, coffee pots, coffee urns, stove, ovens, and warming units by renters. The use of the deep-fat fryers by licensees is prohibited. Any leftover food and liquor must be removed from the premises at the conclusion of the event.

Liquor: Licensee will not charge for (whether by admission fee, donation or otherwise) alcoholic beverages served at Licensee's event and will otherwise comply with all laws regarding the use and consumption of liquor.

Clean-Up: Church is responsible for the clean-up of the parish hall for an additional fee of up to \$300, agreed upon by the Church and the Licensee at the time the facility use agreement is executed. Licensee is responsible for clean-up of the kitchen. Countertops, sinks, ovens, microwaves, appliances, and any other items used for the preparation and service of food are to be cleaned and returned to their storage area. The kitchen floor is to be swept. Proper clean-up of the kitchen is critical to the refund of the damage deposit.

Setup and Deliveries: Licensee will be provided access to the hall in advance of the event for set-up. This access should be coordinated with the Maintenance Supervisor or Business Manager. Decorations shall be reviewed by the Business Manager. Rented or purchased items for the event should not be scheduled for delivery prior to the time Licensee has access to the hall. Licensee should be present for all set-up and deliveries and should act as supervisor to any catering staff. The Church will not be available to accept any deliveries.

The Parish Hall will not be available during Masses or other liturgies. For Saturday evening events, the Parish Hall will not be available for occupancy prior to the conclusion of the 4:30 p.m. Mass. For Saturday afternoon events, the event must conclude, with premises vacated, by 3:30 p.m. <u>All evening events must end, and premises must be vacated by 12:00 Midnight</u>.

Smoking: No smoking is allowed in parish buildings.



SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Confirmation: Upon entering ninth grade, high school-aged teens seeking the

sacrament of confirmation must have completed one year of religious education immediately prior to their sacramental year, either through the parish or parochial school, and should be attending religious education classes. They should have received the sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion. Preparation spans over six months with small group sessions, retreats, service and

time spent with sponsors. Meets monthly. For more information, contact Rob Lickteig, Pastoral Associate - Family Life Ministry, at 816-436-9200, ext. 309.

First Holy Communion: Second graders who have made their first reconciliation, have completed one year of religious education immediately prior to their year of sacramental preparation and are attending religious education classes are eligible to prepare to receive first Eucharist. Parents are required to attend an information meeting and two additional activity events with the child. For more information, contact Jena Duffy, the director of religious education, at 816-436-9200, ext. 308.

First Reconciliation: Children in the second grade, who have completed one year of religious education immediately prior to their year of sacramental preparation and are attending religious education classes, are invited to prepare for the sacrament of first reconciliation. In accordance with church guidelines, children prepare for reconciliation before Eucharist. Parents are required to attend an information meeting, as well as an activity event with their child in preparation for this sacrament. For more information, contact Jena Duffy, the director of religious education, at 816-436-9200, ext. 308.

Belonging Program for Baptism: Parents with infants needing baptism should enroll in the Belonging Program, which is offered quarterly. Expectant parents are encouraged to attend this program early in the pregnancy, before selecting godparents. The program is designed to provide parents with an incredible encounter with Jesus and with the Church. Parents will learn what it means to be children of God and that in the Church, they will always have a place where they belong. Parents must be active registered parish members for six months prior to scheduling baptism or must provide verification of active parish membership from the previous parish. For information or to register,

Baptisms are the second Saturday of the month or the last Sunday of the month after the 11 a.m. Mass.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION CONT'D

Marriage: It usually takes about nine months to prepare for the sacrament of marriage. At least one party must be a registered and active member of Holy Family Parish for at least six months. A wedding date cannot be set until the couple completes the first phase of the marriage preparation program and meets with Fr. Steve.

The first step is to contact Fr. Steve at 816-436-9200, ext. 307. He will then connect you with Peggy Petersen to obtain basic information about you and your faith, explain the preparation program and answer initial questions. Couples will complete a pre-marital inventory. You will then meet with Fr. Steve to set a wedding date, receive feedback from inventory and learn more about the wedding liturgy. At this time, the couple decides on which program they will participate in, either meeting with a lead couple or attending an Engaged Encounter Weekend.

Becoming Catholic: Becoming Catholic focuses on the initiation of adults through reception of the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and Eucharist, usually celebrated in a single liturgy during the Easter Vigil. All are welcome to participate regardless of background. You may join this process at any time during the year. For more information, contact Christen Cota, pastoral associate, at 816-436-9200, ext. 304.

Sacrament of the Sick: Healing Prayer services with the Anointing of the Sick are scheduled a few times a year. For scheduled admissions to a hospital, contact Fr. Steve in advance at 816-436-9200, ext. 307, for anointing. Hospitals do not contact the parish when a parishioner is admitted, due to confidentiality and privacy issues. It is important for parishioners admitted to the hospital to notify the parish or to have a relative or close friend do so. If you wish to receive Communion while hospitalized, notify the hospital at admission.




